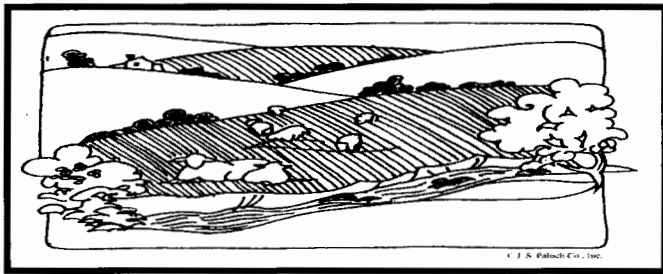

Highlights from the Pope's Letter

for 2018 World Day of Prayer for Vocations

Pope Francis, in his letter for today, points out that when Jesus returned after his time of prayer and struggle in the desert, he did three things before he began his mission. He *listened* to the word, *discerned* the content of the mission entrusted to him by the Father, and proclaimed that he came to accomplish it *today* (Lk 4:16-21).

This model—listen, discern, live—can be followed by all of us as we try live out our vocation. Here are some insights from the Holy Father:

LISTEN | God comes silently and discretely, without imposing on our freedom. Thus it can happen that his voice is drowned out by the many worries and concerns that fill our minds and hearts. We need to learn to silence the noise around us to listen.

DISCERN | We have to resist the temptations of ideology and negativity, and to discover, in our relationship with the Lord, the places, the means, and situations through which he calls us. Discernment requires attentiveness, not distraction!

LIVE | Our vocation is lived *today!* The Christian mission is now! Each one of us is called—whether to the lay life in marriage, to the priestly life in the ordained ministry, or to a life of special consecration—in order to become a witness of the Lord, here and now.

Prayed to the Priesthood



About seven years ago in upstate New York, Sue O'Neal met a young man in her parish named Francis Vivacqua.

Seeing something in him, she asked him if he had ever considered the priesthood. It was a "wow" moment for the young man, setting him on a long path to figuring out his true call in life.

Remarkably, every single day since their encounter, Sue prayed a Divine Mercy Chaplet for Francis. Years after she began praying, he entered the seminary. In 2016, Francis was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Albany. Sue continues to pray for him daily.

Overcoming barriers to a vocation

An estimated 10,000 individuals are discerning a vocation to the priesthood or religious life in the US annually. However, one study showed that as many as 40% are blocked from pursuing their call due to student loans.

Most religious communities cannot assume any debt, and most dioceses allow only a limited amount of debt before accepting a candidate.

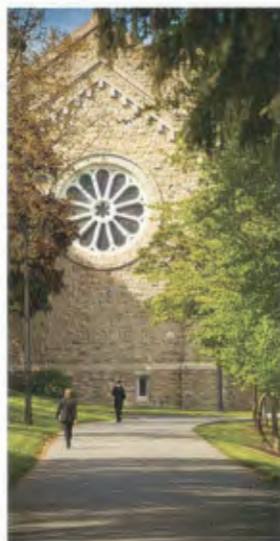
A Catholic organization called the Labouré Society helps men and women resolve education loans in order to enter the seminary, convent, or monastery. The organization brings together groups of aspirants, trains them to fund raise, then sends them out across the U.S. to tell their vocation stories. Nearly 250 young men and women have been able enter formation with the help of Labouré.

Why do Seminarians Need our Prayers?

Because formation to become a priest is extremely hard work! Some have likened it to getting a master's degree while having a full-time job. The man's "job," in this case, though, is forming his heart and mind to be like Jesus, the Good Shepherd. Prayer and study are priorities, but recreation and down time are also important—as is spending time with a good spiritual director. A typical day at the seminary may look like this:



- 6:30 am Rise
- 7:15 am Morning Prayer
- 7:30 am Holy Mass
- 8:00 am Breakfast
- Classes and study time
- Noon Lunch
- Afternoon classes and study
- Sports and exercise
- 5:00 pm Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
- 6:00 pm Evening Prayer
- 6:15 pm Benediction
- 6:30 pm Supper
- 7:30 pm Music practice, formation conferences, or personal and study time
- 11:00 pm Retire

An Uncommon Sight

El Papa Francisco, en su carta de hoy, señala que cuando Jesús regresó después de su tiempo de oración y de lucha en el desierto, Él hizo tres cosas antes de comenzar su misión. Él escuchó la palabra, discernió el contenido de la misión que le encomendó el Padre y proclamó que vino a cumplir hoy (LC 4:16-21).

Este modelo—escuchar, discernir, vivir—puede seguirse por todos nosotros cuando tratamos de vivir nuestras vocaciones. Aquí están algunas reflexiones del Santo Padre:

ESCUCHAR | Dios viene silenciosamente y discretamente, sin imponer en nuestra libertad. Por lo tanto puede ocurrir que su voz es ahogada por las preocupaciones que llenan nuestras mentes y corazones. Tenemos que aprender a silenciar el ruido que nos rodea para escuchar.

DISCERNIR | Tenemos que resistir las tentaciones negatividad e ideología y descubrir, en nuestra relación con el Señor, los lugares, los medios y situaciones a través del cual nos llama. ¡Discernimiento requiere atención, no distracción!

VIVIR | ¡Nuestra vocación se vive hoy! ¡La Misión Cristiana es ahora! Cada uno de nosotros es llamado—a la vida laica en el matrimonio, a la vida sacerdotal en el ministerio ordenado, o a una vida de especial de consagración—para convertirse en un testigo del Señor, ¡aquí y ahora.

Superando barreras a una vocación

Un estimado de 10,000 personas está discerniendo una vocación al sacerdocio o a la vida religiosa en los Estados Unidos anualmente. Sin embargo, un estudio mostró que el 40% están bloqueados de seguir a su llamado debido a préstamos estudiantiles.

La mayoría de las comunidades religiosas no pueden asumir ninguna deuda, y la mayor parte de las diócesis permiten sólo una cantidad limitada de deuda antes de aceptar a un candidato.

Una organización Católica llamada la Sociedad Labouré, ayuda a hombres y mujeres a resolver sus préstamos de educación para entrar en el seminario, convento o monasterio. La organización reúne a grupos de aspirantes, los entrena en como recaudar fondos y luego los envía a través de los Estados Unidos a contar sus historias de vocación. Cerca de 250 hombres y mujeres jóvenes han sido capaces de entrar en formación con la ayuda de Labouré.
