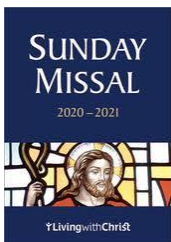

Advent Message

My dear people of St. John Fisher Parish,

As we are about to begin a New Liturgical Year next Sunday with Advent, I wish you all a Holy Season of Advent and Christmas.

The Advent season focuses on expectation and it serves as an anticipation of **Christ's** birth. The season of Advent lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas. This time reminds us of God's love and mercy focused on bringing peace and hope. We, the people of God, during Advent, look back upon Christ's coming in celebration while at the same time looking forward in eager anticipation to the coming of Christ's kingdom when he returns for his people. In this light, the Advent hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" perfectly represents the Church's cry during the Advent season.

*While it is difficult this year of Covid -19, still we are not clear about our Christmas and New Year Liturgical celebrations, let us try our best to be filled with **Hope, Faith, Joy and Peace.***

*As we are limited to 25 people for Holy Mass, all of us cannot get together for Holy Eucharist, I invite all of you to arrange an **Advent Wreath and Candles in your Homes.***



The most common Advent candle tradition involves four candles. A new candle is lit on each of the four Sundays before Christmas. The four candles traditionally represent hope, faith, joy, and peace. Often, the first, second, and fourth candles are purple; the third candle is rose-colored. Occasionally, a fifth white candle is placed in the middle and is lit on Christmas Day to celebrate Jesus' birth. Each Sunday of Advent light one Candle together as a family, as we light the candle during Sunday Mass in the church. A Candle lighting prayer for each Sunday will be added in our bulletin and on our Parish website for your use. You will get more updates about Christmas and New Year Celebrations, through emails, and the website as soon as we get further updates from The Provincial Government and from The Archdiocese.

The Chapel of Eucharistic Adoration hours & procedures. The hours are daily from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. We ask you to respect the following changes at all times for the safety of others:

1. Only 4 Adorers will be allowed in the chapel at one time to ensure social distancing.
2. It is mandatory to wear a mask at all times
3. Sanitize hands before entering the chapel.
4. All reading material has been removed to avoid any cross contamination. Adorers can bring their own reading material but should take it home after their hour.
5. Similarly the sign in sheets have been removed for the time being.
6. The Washroom near the chapel will remain closed.
7. Please don't touch Our Lady's Statue and any other pious articles inside the chapel.

Wardens' Elections 2020

Every year, at this time a notice is read at all Masses on Three consecutive weekends asking for nominations to fill two vacant positions on the board of six wardens. The term of office for these positions begins on January 1, 2021 and ends on December 31, 2023. Exceptionally, this year, because of the pandemic, the notice will be read at all Masses in order to reach as many parishioners as possible, from November 14 to 29. The list of nominated candidates will appear in the December 6 bulletin.

If there are several nominations for each position an election will be held at all Masses on the weekend of December 12 and 13.

What does a warden do? In Quebec the Fabrique Act makes each parish a corporate entity. An essential element of this law is the establishment of a Fabrique, or board of wardens. This body acts as the legal board of directors of the civil corporation, whose purpose is to provide and administer the financial resources necessary for the funding and maintenance of the parish and its property. Along with ensuring financial stability the wardens also oversee and take care of all aspects concerning maintenance of the parish property. With the pastor, the wardens also maintain the financial relationships the parish has with the diocese and other financial entities. Therefore, the election of suitable candidates to serve the parish is an important responsibility of all parishioners.

At all Masses for the next three weekends parishioners will be reminded of the necessity of nominating suitable candidates to fill the two vacant positions. The following criteria must be considered when making a nomination:

- A warden must be a member of the parish, 18 year of age and over.
- Candidates must live within the parish boundaries
- The pastor and board of wardens meet once a month on a Wednesday evening.

If you wish to present your candidacy, please do so by informing the Parish office. If you intend to nominate another person you must have their consent first.

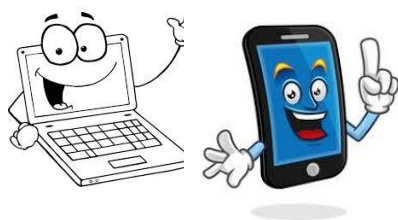

When the End Comes: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Solemnity of Christ the King

The Church year ends today with a vision of the end of time. The scene in the Gospel is stark and resounds with Old Testament echoes. The Son of Man is enthroned over all nations and peoples of every language (see [Daniel 7:13-14](#)). The nations have been gathered to see His glory and receive His judgment (see [Isaiah 66:18](#); [Zephaniah 3:8](#)). The King is the divine shepherd Ezekiel foresees in today's First Reading, judging as a shepherd separates sheep from goats. Each of us will be judged upon our performance of the simple works of mercy we hear in the Gospel today. These works, as Jesus explains today, are reflections or measures of our love for Him, our faithfulness to His commandment that we love God with all our might and our neighbor as ourselves (see [Matthew 22:36-40](#)). Our faith is dead, lifeless, unless it is expressed in works of love (see [James 2:20](#); [Galatians 5:6](#)). And we cannot say we truly love God, whom we cannot see, if we don't love our neighbor, whom we can (see [1 John 4:20](#)). The Lord is our shepherd, as we sing in today's Psalm. And we are to follow His lead, to imitate His example (see [1 Corinthians 1:11](#); [Ephesians 5:1](#)). He healed our sickness (see [Luke 6:19](#)), freed us from the prison of sin and death (see [Romans 8:2, 21](#)), welcomed us who were once strangers to His covenant (see [Ephesians 2:12, 19](#)). He clothed us in Baptism (see [Revelation 3:5](#); [2 Corinthians 5:3-4](#)), and feeds us with the food and drink of His own body and blood. At "the end," He will come again to hand over His kingdom to His Father, as Paul says in today's Epistle. Let us strive to follow Him in right paths, that this kingdom might be our inheritance, that we might enter into the eternal rest promised for the people of God (see [Hebrews 4:1, 9-11](#)). www.stpaulcenter.com/reflections
