MERRY CHRISTMAS! Since Christmas is a Season there is something prophetic and healthy in our Tradition's insisting that we marinate in the Mystery of the Incarnation of God "for us and for our salvation" (Creed at Mass). On this 15th Day of the 2019 Christmas Season we continue to unpack the meaning of the Messiah as we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord**. The word epiphany means "showing forth". It is one thing to be able to perceive God showing forth in **power** (eg., healing the sick; feeding 5,000; walking on water; etc.); however, it is quite another thing to be able (like the Magi) to recognize God showing forth in **obscurity, weakness and dependency** as an infant. What was it that enabled the Magi to recognize the Messiah in weakness, dependency and obscurity? May our time spent with the Magi today transform both our being and our seeing.



"Promoting a Church and a World for All" is the theme for **National Migration Week 2020** that begins today. Each of our families has a migration story. Regardless of where we are and where we came from, we remain part of the human family and are called to live in solidarity with one another. For nearly a half century, the Catholic Church in the United States has celebrated National Migration Week, which is an opportunity for the Church to reflect on the circumstances confronting migrants, including immigrants, refugees, children, and victims and survivors of human trafficking.

Unfortunately, in our contemporary culture we often fail to encounter migrants as persons, and instead look at them as unknown others, if we even notice them at all. We do not take the time to engage migrants in a meaningful way, as fellow children of God, but remain aloof to their presence and suspicious and fearful of them. "AN END and A BEGINNING" – Next Sunday (Jan. 12) we will celebrate the **Feast of the Baptism of the Lord**---the final day of the Christmas Season 2019. Our annual celebration of the Christmas Event is not complete until we ritually fast-forward from the infant in the manger to the man in the river. What does this plunging (*baptidzein* in Greek) of the adult Jesus into the Jordan have to do with Christmas?

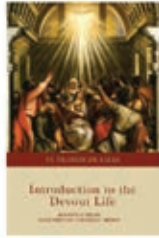
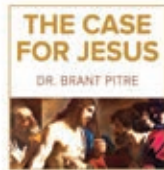


Why do Catholics practice Works of Mercy?
