



**REVEALING ATTIRE** – The outermost vestment that a Pope or an Archbishop wears is called the Pallium which is made from lambswool and is meant to be the “first thing”, the outermost thing we notice when we look at the earthly leaders of the Church. The pallium calls to mind a lamb on the shoulders of a shepherd and recall Jesus’s words, “The Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost” (Luke 19:10). Actions speak and the action of wearing a pallium says that we are to be a community whose first priority, uppermost interest and outermost characteristic is seeking out and serving those who are lost: certainly those who are lost in sin, but also those who are lost in addiction; have lost their health; lost their hope; lost their bearings; lost their identity; lost their faith.
