The St. Mother Teresa Furniture program is in need of men to pick up and deliver furniture to those in need.

We receive many calls from people in our local area in need of furniture. This includes beds, dressers, kitchen tables and chairs, sofas and love seats.

We utilize our parish pickup truck for which all volunteers are insured once they take the safe driver course from Catholic Mutual Group on-line for free. Our truck then goes to the donor's home where the furniture is either in the garage or on the driveway for pick up.

It is then either brought directly to our storage shed at Life Storage off Larkin Drive or delivered to the recipient.

Once brought to the recipient's home/apartment the furniture is dropped off. The drivers are not permitted into the recipient's home as it is their responsibility to bring it into their home.

Nancy Seliga, the program coordinator, for the past ten years, carefully schedules all pick ups and deliveries weekly.

Whatever your availability is, we can work with you! Perhaps you and a friend can work together? This is a much needed ministry in our area. We have helped hundreds of people in need since this programs inception.

Our Food Pantry distributes food for the week, to over 350, seniors -- men, women and children every week. We are very fortunate to receive fresh produce weekly from the Farmer's Market of Monroe and Museum Village. This has been in effect from May through October.

We are weekly recipients of bread and cakes from Stop and Shop, Panera and at times, BJs.

We also receive several hundreds of pounds of groceries from Shop Rite.
