How to Dispose of Blessed Religious Objects Properly

As Catholics, we are accustomed to having religious objects "blessed," which signifies the permanent sanctification and dedication of an object for some sacred purpose. Once a religious object is blessed and dedicated for divine worship or veneration, it must be treated with reverence and must not be used in either an improper or profane way.

When blessed religious objects break or wear from use, the basic rule for the disposition of these items is to burn or bury them. Polluted or excess holy water must be poured into the ground. Palms are to be burned and returned to the ground. A broken rosary or religious statue normally would be buried. In all, the underlying idea is that what has been dedicated to God should be returned to God. Never should one just throw out what has been dedicated to God.
