

Catholic Charities Campaign for Charity and Justice Collection November 23-24

The Campaign for Charity and Justice is an initiative to revitalize and increase Catholic Charities support for the charitable and justice work of parishes and community groups. **This Campaign transforms and replaces in all the parishes of the Archdiocese of New York, the annual CCHD collection on the Sunday before Thanksgiving (November 24, 2019).**

The funds raised through this collection will support parish and community-based projects through grants that meet local needs, particularly those of our poor and vulnerable neighbors. Grants will be made in the five main mission areas of Catholic Charities: protecting and nurturing children and youth, feeding the hungry and sheltering the homeless, strengthening families and resolving crises, supporting the physically and emotionally challenged, and welcoming and integrating immigrants and refugees.

Greetings:

It's that time of the year when so many people realize the importance of "giving back" to helping those less fortunate.

What a blessing that we realize the significance of Our Lord's command that we "Love the Lord our God with all our hearts and love our neighbor as ourselves." We concretize that love when we put our faith into action, by serving those in need.

We receive so many calls to assist during the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays, a time when we are overflowing with volunteers. It would be absolutely wonderful if those who have never served before would call us in January or February to make their requests known. We would be more than delighted to add them to our list of volunteers.

Here are some ways you and your children can assist us at this time:

1. *Host a neighborhood food drive.* Give your neighbors a list of much needed food items:

tuna fish, cereal, oatmeal, canned chicken, peanut butter, jelly, spaghetti, sauce, rice shelf-stable milk, coffee, canned fruit, canned vegetables and soup

Give them a brown paper bag with a note attached with the items listed above and explain that you are collecting food for Sacred Heart Parish Outreach Food Pantry and that if they could place the filled bag on their front porch you will pick it up on a specific date and time.
