God bless us all, and God bless America!

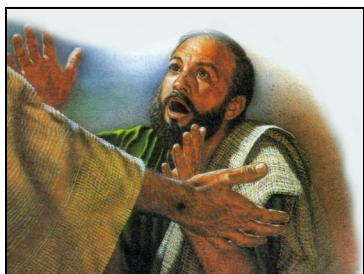
