A VIEW FROM THE PEW

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS (Mark 7:31-37)



In this Gospel, Jesus ventures into pagan territory, and heals a deaf man who had a speech impediment. Undoubtedly, His saving action makes a person a believer and disciple. However, there are obstacles that stand in the way of discipleship: the inability to listen and to speak. A person has nothing to say if they cannot listen and assimilate the message in the healing makes this point. He says to the man's ears are opened, his speech impediment is removed. It is possible for us to hear and understand the Gospel, and Jesus empowers us to testify to that message by word and action.

But there is also a region in our hearts so foreign to the Gospel that it resists Jesus and conversion, and places obstacles to grace. The symptoms are deafness, blindness, spiritual paralysis — whatever conditions show that the Good News has not yet penetrated the shadowlands of our interior life. But thanks be to God that Jesus and His grace enter even the most hostile and rugged regions, open the least sensitive hearts, and loose the tongues of the least probable to proclaim the Gospel.

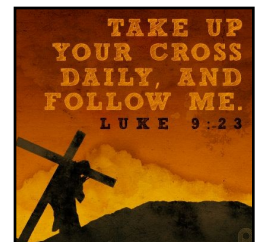

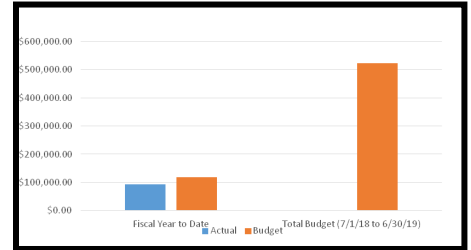

FLU CLINIC

The best protection from this upcoming flu season is to receive an influenza vaccination. This year, Mary Star of the Sea Church will be having an on-site flu vaccination clinic held inside the social hall on Sunday, September 16, 2018 from 8AM-12PM. Immunizations will be administered by certified immunizing pharmacists from Longs Drugs/CVS Health. The flu shot is free under most insurance plans such as HMSA, HMAA, HMA, UHA, Express Scripts, Medicare, Medicaid, etc. Unfortunately, Longs does not participate with Kaiser insurance. For individuals without insurance, the cost is \$40.99 for the quadrivalent and \$66.99 for the high dose flu shot. Longs Drugs is also offering a \$5 off \$25 purchase coupon for any flu shot recipient. Please feel free to e-mail or call me if you have any questions.
