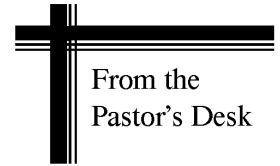

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Peace and Blessings!



As your Pastor, it is with deepest gratitude and appreciation that I bring you highlights of the past fiscal year. On behalf of Fr. Pat, Bro. Buddy, and the leaders of our beloved Parish, thank you one and all for all your prayers and support, which allowed us to meet the goals set in both the Parish and Diocesan Pastoral Plans.

First and foremost, after a financial review from the auditors hired by the Diocese, I am very pleased to inform you that our Parish, the ELC, and Mary, Star of the Sea School are all in compliance with Federal, State and Diocesan policies. And we intend to continue to do our best to ensure that our Parish and school resources are safeguarded.

Let me share some highlights of our finances as printed in this bulletin. You will note a slight increase in the offertory collection compared to last year. There was a significant increase in our electronic offertory method since we launched it two years ago. We received \$30,817.17 from E-giving. From the proceeds of the East Honolulu Food Festival, each entity received \$22,830.55. Our employment costs went up a bit due to hiring a part-time Music Coordinator and Youth and Young Adult Minister. There was a significant increase in leadership development because we sent delegates to the Catechetical Congress in Los Angeles and the International Stewardship Conference in Georgia. Repairs and Maintenance Costs were low. We have completed major projects to maintain our facilities and grounds. Our Parish Assessment is also low. The \$200,000.00 subsidy we gave MSOS was deducted from our total income before computing the assessment due to the Diocese. For the past fiscal year, we gave \$60,000.00 to MSOS School and \$40,000.00 to ELC. Charitable contributions went up significantly as we contributed \$4000.00 through Aid to Church in Need to rebuild churches and homes in the devastated Nineveh Plains in Iraq by ISIS terrorist groups. We received a grant of \$1,500.00 from Catholic Relief Services and through our Social Action Ministry/Youth Ministry, we served about 60 children (Food for Kids Program) living in Kuhio Park Terraces. The program will run through April 2019. Our Parish provides the additional funds to supplement the grant. We also extend financial aid to Africa through priests and sisters working there and to Religious congregations for the formation of their seminarians. Overall, our financial position is good and I sincerely thank you again for all your support.

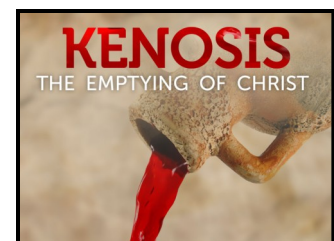
Regarding our Parish ministries: we completed two Bible study programs which were well attended; the Healing Hearts Ministry completed four Seasons of Hope sessions throughout the year; several training sessions were held to welcome newly-sent-forth Eucharistic Ministers and Lectors; the Stewardship Committee introduced innovations to encourage parishioner participation in the various ministries at their disposal, and I encourage all of you to prayerfully consider sharing your God-given gifts of self and join one of our many ministries.

Through the grace and mercy of God and the intercession of our Blessed Mother, we have accomplished a great many things for His honor and glory, and the good of our sisters and brothers. As a Eucharistic community, let us continue on this journey with great faith and hope in our compassionate Father and our Lord Jesus Christ.

Keeping all of you in my prayers, especially in the celebration of Mass!

I have been blessed to have experienced the goodness that God has placed in my life; the gift of TRUTH and the gift of VOCATION, and if there is anything that I have learned since my time as a youth minister, it is that the youth (or really all of us) need a relationship with Jesus.

Young people are not to be brushed off as immature, or not smart enough to understand what we are teaching them about our Catholic faith. Our youth are very capable and I see that they are thinking about the world and how God fits into their everyday lives. I have seen youth attend Eucharistic Adoration for the first time and leave transformed. Youths are both uncomfortable and comforted. These reactions are normal, because for the first time they have experienced what it means to be truly quiet and at peace. That is not only powerful, but miraculous. Our young people need a safe place; a place to escape from the distractions of the outside world and we are able to offer them that if we simply invite them. So invite young people, invite your family members and friends to our parish community.

Prayer works and, most importantly, a relationship with Christ works. I continue to humbly ask for your continued prayers and support for this ministry and I hope that you are talking about.

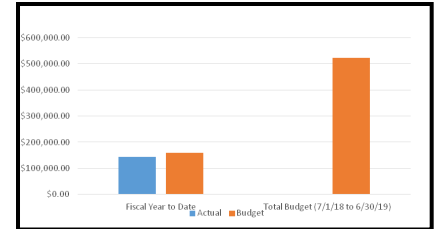
