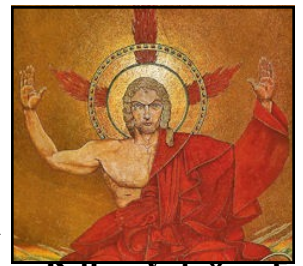

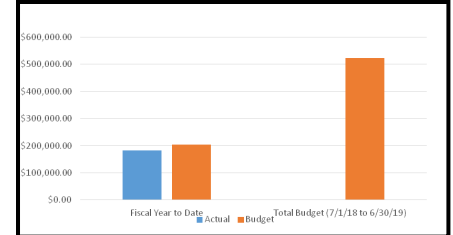

### American Red Cross Safety & Disaster Preparedness Presentation to ELC Kindergarteners

The American Red Cross visited Mary, Star of the Sea Early Center and taught the ELC Kindergarteners about fire safety, evacuation procedures and disaster preparedness. The book "Prepare with Pedro: Disaster Preparedness Activity," is a publication created by the Federal Emergency Management Region V office in partnership with the American Red Cross.
