Connection to the Cross this Week
Fourth Sunday of Lent
Embracing Forgiveness



“In Christ, God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.” (2 Corinthians 5:19)

This week, let's commit to working on forgiving offense, even something very small. Just concentrate on one offense by one person. Forgiveness does not always start with a feeling; it often starts with the decision to work on the desire to forgive. Like the father of the prodigal son, try not to put any condition on your forgiving. Oftentimes those who have wronged you will never apologize and will never change. They may even have already died.

Forgiveness is an act of mercy, a response to the mercy we have received from Jesus. This is difficult work! Let's unite any difficulties or sufferings we repent, apologize and forgive.



Laetare Sunday
Fourth Sunday of Lent

In the reformed calendar this Sunday is not different from the other Sundays of Lent even though the entrance antiphon for the day still begins with "rejoice" and the vestments colored, not violet. The day is important since its mood and theme were one of hope and rejoicing that Easter was near. The day is important because it is the day of the second scrutiny in preparation for the Baptism of adults at the Easter Vigil.

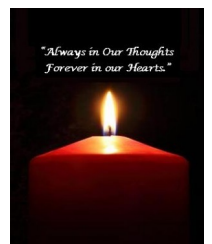

Mary, Star of the Sea Early Learning Center
Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Classes
Level I, Part B: June 3-7 & 10-14, 2019

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CSG) is a faith formation program, using the Montessori hands-on approach, and is designed to help our children fall in love with Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and our Church life. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd utilizes a dedicated and prepared space for children, called the Atrium. The Atrium is a special room dedicated to presenting lessons about our Catholic faith, the Mass, the Eucharist and Holy Scripture. The Atrium is filled with child-sized furnishings and manipulative models of people, places and objects found in scripture and liturgy. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd provides children with the time to reflect upon the stories of Scripture; the Sacraments of Baptism and the Eucharist; and the way in which we pattern time upon the life of Christ in a series of fasts and feast. Mary, Star of the Sea Early Learning recently converted one of its classrooms into an Atrium. In the Atrium, children are engaged in faith formation and learn how to properly use the materials. Level 1 course (Parts A and B) prepares participants to work with children ages 3-6 years. Level 2 course (Parts A and B) prepares catechists to work with children ages 6-9 years. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is sponsored by the Office of Religious Education, Diocese of Honolulu.
