Dear Pro-Life Friends,

Building on the success of the 40 Days for Life vigil, Saint James has committed to maintaining a prayer vigil on two days of the month, one day at each of the two abortuaries in our parish:

8:30 – Noon, Planned Parenthood, 370 S Washington Street

2nd Saturday Vigil

7:30am – 11:00am, Falls Church Healthcare Center, 900 South Washington Street

If you can help us maintain this peaceful and prayerful vigil, please respond to this email with the hour(s) that you wish to take. Please indicate if you wish this to be a re-curring monthly commitment (you can always change your commitment later).

Abortions are known to be performed at these sites during the times of the vigil.

The following passage opened my eyes to the importance of being present at the abortion site:

‘Could you not watch one hour with me?’ (Mt. 26:40)

Would you spend some time with the little babies in your own neighborhood before they die? Maybe you'll even be able directly to save lives; maybe not. What's even more important: you'll be there. In a sense, it may be a way to redeem the abandonment of Jesus by His apostles when they refused to be with Him at His death. Too often we also refuse to be with Jesus for fear of the Cross, do we not?

These little ones dying today are intricately connected with the sufferings and death of Our Savior. There is a bond here that must not be overlooked. All the political action, educating, donation of funds, demonstrations, alternative work, important and necessary as these are, do not make up for an absence at the death scene. Thus, let me beg you to view your presence at the killing center in your area as the place where God wants you to be.

Grab your Rosary, pick up your Bible, bring your devotionals, and go out to the Calvary not far from you – where Christ is being crucified today in your midst.

... we may not be able to save their lives, but can we not plead on their behalf? And should they die, as usually happens (God forgive us!), let us lift up our hearts to God Almighty on their behalf ... it will be the only human love they will know on this earth...

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN: A PROGRESS REPORT

Many brother Knights have expressed great interest in exactly how the Capital Campaign funds are being used and what are plans for the next few years.

When the Capital Campaign began in the fall of 2006, the state of the Council infrastructure was in serious disrepair. The roof and gutters on the Council Home were badly damaged, the exterior of the Council Home had not been painted for many years, part of the HVAC system had to be replaced, the fire alarm system was obsolete, and the concrete and rails leading to the entrance of the main hall were a safety concern.

In order to get started on the badly needed work, the Columbus Club borrowed \$211,000. Proceeds of the Capital Campaign were used as needed to make the monthly payments. The balance on the original loan has been paid down to \$170,000, and the entire note will be paid by 2011.

Up to now, the Capital Campaign has raised more than \$118,000—none of it has yet been spent. \$15,000 was borrowed from the Campaign funds to pay an unanticipated tax bill and equipment purchases. These funds will be paid back by April 2008.

Where are we now? In addition to owing \$170,000 on the original borrowing, we have uncovered a wide range of repairs and capital improvements that will have to be addressed during the next two years.

These include the following: reroofing of the main hall, recoating of pool liners in the swimming pools, resurfacing of the pool deck, resurfacing of the parking lots, repair of the tennis court, rebuilding the roof structure of the barbeque pit, replacement of sliding glass doors, and a complete renovation of the lower lounge in the main building.

Although we have not received bids on all these items, our best estimate is that these projects will cost approximately \$420,000. When added to the \$170,000 we currently owe, we are left with a need to raise \$590,000 to bring the capital infrastructure to where it needs to be.

We intend to meet these financial commitments in three ways. The Columbus Club officers are confident that they can pay off the \$170,000 loan out of general operating revenues. The \$420,000 will be financed by the Capital Campaign. Since we have already raised \$118,000 that leaves us with a need to raise some \$300,000 by the beginning of 2011.

This will require a serious commitment on the part of all of us to participate in the Capital Campaign. When we started, we knew we had a formidable job ahead of us to repair the infrastructure of a facility that had gone into serious disrepair. We have made some great strides in fixing the most serious problems, and, with all of your help, we can get the job done.

New AT&T Cell Tower Lease Finalized— We have been working with AT&T since June 2005 and on February 28, 2008, the lease was executed. The new cell tower will be located on the 3rd floor roof of the Main Hall. Many hours were put into the effort, review of construction plans to meet our needs, and lease negotiations. Simulated photos of the cell tower (where the tower is superimposed in real photographs) are available in the office for your review. **Big thanks to our professional members who donated their time and expertise to make this a reality – Mike Kearney and Colin Uckert.** This is a 30 year lease with 6 five year renewals starting out at \$2,000 per month with yearly escalation clauses. To put in this in perspective, AT&T will be spending approximately \$250,000 for the construction of this site on our property. One of their most expensive sites to build! FYI - Other cell tower firms on site – T-Mobile and Sprint.

Capital Improvements – By the time you read this article, we will have closed out all the capital improvements that were approved in 2006. The last item, the asbestos issue in the CH basement, was completed on March 14, 2008. In this issue you will see the presentation of all the items that were completed. Also in this issue you will see the presentation of the capital improvements for 2008 and beyond. From this presentation the Board did approve the following based on priority and essential items that need to be done now - BBQ rebuild of the roof structure (not to exceed \$25,000), upgrade of the corporations computer systems at about \$7000 (will bring it into the 21st century), new chairs for pool lounge at about \$950. As an FYI, the corporation is paying about \$6,000 per month for loan repayments.

Also, the Board is investigating at this time a package for the complete renovation of the lower lounge. Items such as new 2X 2 ceiling tile installation, renovation of the bar, improvements to the lighting system, retiling the entire floor, overhauling the foyer with drywall and new wood entrance doors similar to the Main Hall doors. More to follow on this in May Knight Life.
