MANAGER'S CORNER

Greetings to everyone and Happy Spring!

If you have been up here lately you may have noticed a few changes. Due to the efforts of Owen Beirne Jr. and the Board of Directors we have had all the asphalt seal coated and striped at NO charge to the Club, that's right No charge! Also the pools have all been refurbished with new white coat, colored tiles, coping tiles around the edges. I am looking forward to a great summer around the Campus.

That brings me to another point I would like to address. We have a long-standing rule of no cans or glass bottles on the grounds. I would like to explain why. The first reason is obviously a safety issue. With all the people running around in bare feet, cans with sharp edges and glass from broken bottles can cut peoples feet. The second reason is that our ABC license from the State of Virginia requires that **All beer and wine consumed on the grounds be purchased from the Club.** We have periodic inspections to see if we are in compliance and if we are in violation, the Club can be fined or our license to serve alcohol could be revoked. To keep your dues low, we rely on this income from the CH Bar, Clarke's Lounge, and outside parties to help offset the enormous amount of money it takes to keep this property maintained and running properly. I thank you in advance for your consideration on this matter.

Another person I would like to thank is Bob Clarke, who has spearheaded the resurrection of the Family Breakfast. Through his hard work and the hard work of the volunteers who work every third Sunday of the month, the Family Breakfast has become hugely successful.

I want to remind everyone, we have a Mother's Day Buffet, Supper Club, Family Breakfast, and the Memorial Day picnic this month.

Thank you again to all the volunteers at the Club who help me make this the special place it is.

UPDATE ON THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PHASE III

By the time you get this Knight Life, the curing process on the white coating of all three pools will only have about 15 days to go (total curing time is 30 days after application). The white coating was applied on Tuesday April the 6th and the pools began filling at 5:00pm the same day. The pools were completely filled that following Saturday.

As to the renovation of the all three pools, it all went very well and American Pool, under the leadership of Marty Gates (he was at the Special Meeting in November 2009), has done an outstanding job. As a reminder as to what has been done:

Coping stone replacement to all three (3) pools

Waterline tile replacement to all three (3) pools

Complete plaster removal of dive, lap pool, and wading pool

Resurface all three (3) pools with whitecoat

Replacement of return fittings in dive pool and lap pool

Remove existing caulk and/or joint filler and reinstall to all three (3) pools

Installed transition and trim tile lines in dive pool
Installed tiled racing lanes and targets in lap pool
Change order - Installed new code required pool drains in the lap and dive pools

Change order - Installed 4 ladder pads and anchors in the lap pool and dive pool

The Budget for the pool renovation was \$110,000; however it looks like we are coming under budget by about \$3,000.

The replacement of the Main Hall Roof was completed in early December, with very minor work completed in March. Certainly God was looking out for us since we had that big snow storm in mid December 2009 and the two Really Big snow storms in early February. No leaks whatsoever! If we had not taken off the two old roofs and replaced it with the new one, God only knew what chaos would have ensued. Thank you to Marty Koerner, once again, for an outstanding job well done! The Budget for the roof replacement was \$90,000; however we came in under budget at about \$78,000.

Just to share with you a funny story as we went through this process, one member asked "why do the contractors need to start this fall (2009) when our winters are very mild."

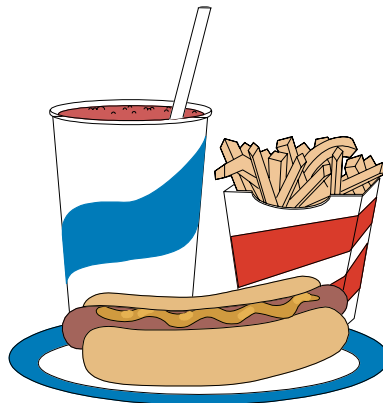

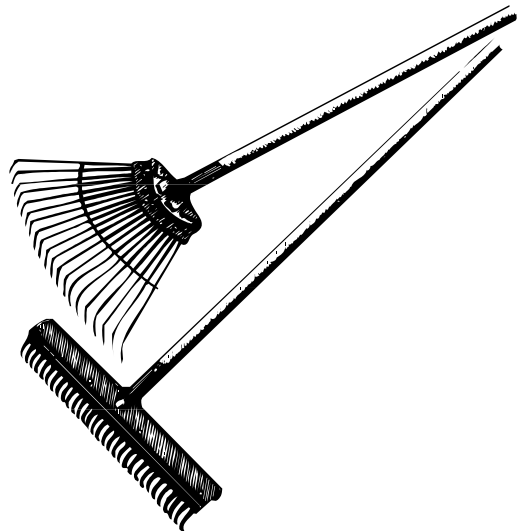
The deadline to make your reservations is Saturday, June 5. Only 50 tickets will be sold. Therefore, you are advised to make your reservations NOW!

If you are a WWII Vet or if you know of anyone who is a WWII Vet, could you please get in contact with me?

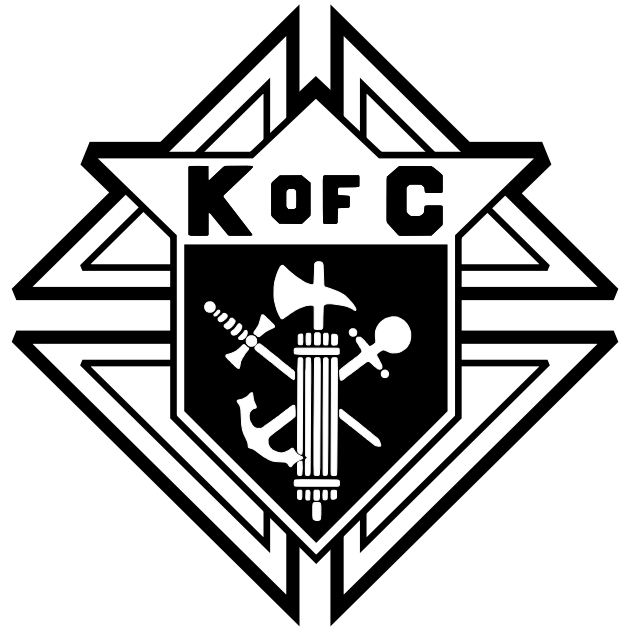
