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## IMPORTANT NOTICE OF UPCOMING MEETINGS

On April 16, 2015, and May 7, 2015, the Board of Directors will hold meetings to inform the membership of the potential benefits of allowing the Board to solicit, negotiate and execute a “Transfer of Development Rights” (TDR) and create a “Conservation Easement.” In sum, the successful execution of these transactions would bring a substantial sum of money to help us maintain and improve our property for years to come, while minimizing taxes and preserving EDW’s current footprint (with a buffer to develop additional buildings/facilities, if needed).

This is an important decision that will be made **by the membership**. Please plan to attend both meetings and remember to be ready to show your 2015 membership card if you attend the meetings.

*What is a TDR and how do they work? TDRs are a legal framework to facilitate the transfer of density (the right to build improvements of a certain size) from one parcel of real property (the sending site) to another parcel of real property (the receiving site). Ideally, TDRs are transferred from an area where the community would like to restrict additional development, to an area (such as the metro’s Orange line Rosslyn – Ballston corridor) where the community would like to encourage additional development. Once the development rights are transferred, the sending site loses its right to develop to the extent of the transferred density (analogous to a voluntary down-zoning), and the receiving site has the right to develop a larger building to the extent of the transferred density. TDRs are transferred to projects through the County’s site plan approval process – so a developer must be far along in a project’s planning in order to accommodate the TDR transaction. The TDR transaction is memorialized by recordation of a deed among the County land records (a Deed of Severance).*

*We would still own the property. We could still sell it and, we could still mortgage it.*

### MARCH 11 TDR COMMITTEE MEETING RECOMMENDATIONS

In consideration of the uniqueness and complexities of TDRs, the TDR committee met and set two meetings, **April 16 and May 7**, as “Town Hall” information dates to coincide with regular meetings. A formal presentation of the concepts under consideration will be made at the first meeting and questions will be permitted. The second meeting will allow the Committee to properly research and answer questions that could not be answered at the first meeting. It is hoped that following unanswered questions, a discussion, debate and vote will be taken at the May 7 meeting.

More importantly, the committee also voted unanimously to recommend to the Board that it adopt three important measures in proceeding forward. The first recommendation is to adopt a three phase process (information/ vote; if approved, negotiation and investment). The second recommendation is to present two separate issues to the vote of the membership, to allow the Board to negotiate and execute a TDR and, similarly, to create and execute a conservation easement. The third recommendation is that the Board agrees to keep the proceeds from such transactions intact and entrust the membership with the decision on the use and investment of proceeds.

These recommendations were not approved at the time this article went to press. However, in consideration of the committee’s unanimous agreement, it is anticipated the recommendations will be unanimously ratified by the Board at its meeting on March 24.
