Religious Freedom Week, Special Online Symposium

Religious Freedom Week takes place June 22-29. The USCCB has chosen the theme "For the Good of All".

Religious freedom is both an American value and an important part of Catholic teaching on human dignity. When we promote religious freedom, we promote the common good and strengthen the life of our nation and the community of nations.

There will be a Special Online Symposium on Religious Freedom-Religious Freedom in the Time of COVID-on Monday, June 22, 7-8:30pm. Before COVID-19 people of faith in the U.S. and around the world experienced a depreciation of the fundamental human rights of religious worship, practice and conscience in the public square. Necessary social distancing steps to protect public health imposed by the states that restrict public gatherings for worship, while secular businesses such as liquor stores are deemed "essential", have challenged people of religious conviction who stay home to protect the health of others yet must guard against letting this crisis set lasting precedents that erode First Amendment protections for religious minorities.

This online event is by invitation only. Participants who register will be sent a link the day of the event. Register at <https://archkck18.wufoo.com/forms/qqzq2ih1t4hd7e/> or visit www.archkck.org/socialjustice. Speakers are Chuck Weber, Executive Director for Kansas Catholic Conference, Elizabeth R. Kirk JD, Author, Legal Scholar & Director of St. Lawrence Center's Institute for Faith & Culture, and Louis Brown JD, Executive Director for Christ Medicus Foundation. There will also be a discussion moderated by Deacon Bill Scholl, Social Justice Consultant for the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas.

In addition to the symposium, the USCCB provides "Pray-Reflect-Act" documents at www.usccb.org/ReligiousFreedomWeek - one for each day on different religious liberty topics to help people learn about religious liberty from a Catholic perspective, pray about particular issues, and act on what they learn by advocating for policies that promote religious freedom. Through prayer, education and public action we can promote the essential right of religious freedom for Catholics and for those of *all* faiths.
