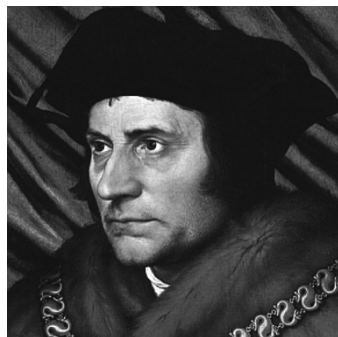

Fourth Sunday of Easter

The readings for the Fourth Sunday of Easter speak to our human need to name what God has done for us in the death and resurrection of Jesus. In today's first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, we read parts of Peter's speech before the Sanhedrin. In this speech Peter names Jesus as "the cornerstone" which "the builders" (the Sanhedrin) rejected, quoting the Hebrew Scriptures (Ps 118:22 and Is 28:16). Peter also identifies Jesus as Israel's prophesied "cornerstone" upon which our salvation is built.

The second reading, taken from the First Letter of John, continues to develop the idea of naming believers in Christ as "children of God." We are "children of God" because of God's love for us, because Jesus is the Son of God and we now share life in the divine family, and because we are assured that "we shall be like him."

In the Gospel reading, Jesus names himself as "the good shepherd" in two different ways. In the first instance, Jesus is "the good shepherd" because he willingly "lays down his life for the sheep." In the second example, Jesus is "the good shepherd" because he leads the sheep of all other folds; although there are many folds, there is but one flock and one shepherd.
