Course Objectives

- To explore the general developmental characteristics and the most vital religious needs of the 6-9 year-old child.
- To facilitate further meditate on the Biblical and liturgical themes of the Catechesis.
- To offer guidelines and assistance in preparing the atrium, making the catechist's album and materials for the Level II atrium.
- To deepen participants ability to observe and learn from children, while also exploring avenues for deepening parental and congregational ability to observe and learn from children.

Course Description

The course grounds the participant in the theory and praxis of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd while concretely preparing him/her to develop and facilitate an atrium for 6-9 year olds. Prerequisite: CGS Level I Training

Participants will complete shared album pages during this course that will be distributed upon completion of the course.

Participants must attend a minimum of 90% of the course to receive certification.

Material making opportunities will be offered with a minimal fee for materials.

Participants will be asked to bring their own food.

Certification

Upon successful completion of the course, participants are eligible to receive a certificate from the National Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

In order to receive the certificate, participants are expected to attend all sessions or make up sessions, read assigned texts, and observe in Montessori and atrium environments.

Participants are also eligible to receive advanced catechetical certification within the Diocese of Columbus. Diocesan Catholic School teachers can receive CEUs for attendance.

History

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based method of spiritual formation for children, beginning at age 3.

It seeks to create and facilitate a 'hands-on' space for children called an atrium in which both children and adults can hear, ponder and celebrate the most essential mysteries of the Christian faith, as revealed in Scripture and Liturgy.

Originally developed in Rome by Sofia Cavalletti and Gianna Gobbi, the catechesis continues to spread world-wide and is used, with adaptations, by various Christian traditions.
