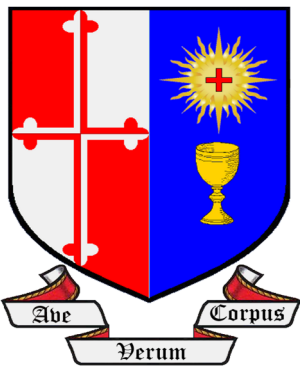

A Mayonnaise Jar and 2 Cups of Coffee

When things in your life seem almost too much to handle, when 24 hours in a day are not enough, try to remember this lesson now and again.

A professor once stood before his philosophy class with some items in front of him. When the class began, he wordlessly picked up a very large, but empty mayonnaise jar, and proceeded to fill it with golf balls. He then asked the students if the jar was full. They all agreed that it was.

The professor then picked up a box of pebbles, poured them into the jar, and shook it lightly. As the pebbles rolled into the open areas between the golf balls, he then asked the students if the jar was now full. Once again they agreed it was. The professor next picked up a box of sand and poured it into the jar. Of course, the sand filled up everything else. Once more he asked if the jar was full. The students responded with a unanimous “yes!”

Producing two cups of coffee from under the table, he poured the entire contents into the jar, effectively filling the empty space between the sand. All the students could do at this point was laugh. “Now,” said the professor as the laughter subsided, “I want you to recognize that this jar represents your life. The golf balls are the important things.... your family, your children, your health, your friends and your favorite passions. If everything else was lost and only they remained, your life would still be full. The pebbles are the other things that matter, like your job, your house and your car. The sand is everything else.... the small stuff!”

“If you put the sand into the jar first,” he continued, “there would be no room for the pebbles or the golf balls.” The same goes for life. “If you spend all your time and energy on the small stuff, you will never have room for the things that are important to you.”

“Pay attention to the things that are critical to your happiness. Play with your children. Take time to get medical checkups. Take your spouse out to dinner. Play another 18 holes of golf, go to a movie in the middle of the day, take a well deserved nap. There will always be time to clean the house or fix the garbage disposal, or any of a hundred other things that pop up. Take care of the golf balls first.... ‘the things that really matter!’ Set your priorities. The rest is just sand!”

When he was finished speaking, one of the students raised her hand and inquired what the coffee represented. The professor smiled and said, “I’m glad you asked. It just goes to show you that no matter how full your life may seem, there’s *always* room for a couple of cups of coffee with a friend...”

Life is short and we have never too much time for gladdening the hearts of those who are traveling the dark journey with us.
