Message from the Pastor

We have had registrations for Holy Rosary School over the past month or so and I am happy to report that all of our 4th through 7th graders are coming back next year, which is very encouraging. So we will have 8 eighth graders next year. Also, we will have 28 new Kindergartners next year. That's the biggest classes we've had in a while. We will have around 123 K through 8th grade students next school year, not counting Pre-K (an increase of 16 from this year.)

Although the growth has been a little less than I was planning, I think that we are at a good place now with the teaching staff, students and families. When I arrived at Holy Rosary many told me that we would have to close the 7th and 8th grades for lack of students. I never even considered that. We are building from the lower grades and in 3 years we should have a good number of 8th graders graduating. If you figure a class of 20 students starting out in 1st grade, we should see at least 12 to 15 graduating 8th grade (or more, I hope). That's a good number and should increase every year as families see the value of their children completing 8th grade and entering high school as well-educated and well-formed individuals; not to mention the solid Christian formation they receive.

Of course our school can't do it alone; we need the Holy Rosary families to support what their kids are learning in school and practice it with them. I hope and pray for the day when all the Holy Rosary families are here in church every Sunday, giving their kids the greatest help in their education program – living their Catholic Faith.

And our school couldn't do it without the parish's support. Thank you to all who give your time, talent and treasure for the good of the school. It is amazing what our parishioners are doing to support the school. You all are a big part of what we are able to do with the children who attend Holy Rosary School.

May God continue to bless our teachers, our staff, our students and their families with a solid Christian educational program and keep Holy Rosary on track with Catholic identity to build a God-centered, wholesome and virtuous society. *Fr. Dany*

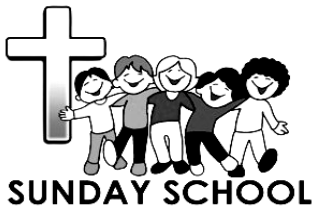
Hospital Visits Information
