Message from the Pastor

We had a great trip to Washington, D.C. with the Holy Rosary students. It was a grueling but informative and inspirational tour of our nation's capital. I had gone with the group two years ago, but just for two days. This is the first time I spent the whole week on tour of D.C. Thank you to Mr. Dave Bertke who organized the trip, and to the chaperones who helped keep things under control. Of course, our Holy Rosary kids were great and well-behaved.

At Holy Rosary we will be starting the renovation project very soon (like next week) with the addition of the adoration chapel on the north side of church. Then after the festival is over you will see major construction between the church and the school. It's going to be kind of messy for a few months, but how pleased we will all be with the result.

St. Patrick's parishioners, if you missed the town hall meeting a week ago, Tuesday, at church concerning the condition of the stained glass windows and what will need to be done to restore and preserve them, I think, of those who were there, we all agreed that something needs to be done. Looking at our parish finances we have nearly \$65,000 in savings at the end of the fiscal year. The cost of the window restoration is between \$120,000 and \$140,000. I think we can proceed with our savings and take a loan for the difference. Then, each month, you can put a little into the Capital Improvements collection envelope to pay it off and we should be fine.

To begin, we are going to give the entrance to church a makeover, including the stained glass window above the door. All in all we are going to restore, preserve and beautify St. Patrick's Church for generations to come. I think it is worth doing.

I am very proud to be the pastor of such great parishes. You are very committed to your churches, very generous with you time, talent and treasure, and a real joy to serve as your priest.

I hope we can continue to build the kind of parishes where people can feel uplifted and nourished spiritually for years to come. God bless all of you and thank you for your prayers for me. Fr. Carry



SCHOENSTATT PICTURE OF GRACE

The Schoenstatt Picture of Grace was crafted by the Schoenstatt Brothers of Mary in Germany. The picture of Grace then went on pilgrimage to Weisskirchen, Pfaffenhofen, Dachau, Munich, Memholz, Liebfraudenhohe and Frankfurt in Germany plus Mols and Quarten in Switzerland. In July of 1989, the picture traveled to Wisconsin where it was blessed before arriving in Sidney, Ohio, on July 12. Since arriving, the Schoenstatt picture of Mother and Child has visited many churches. Catholic centers, schools and Marian conferences in Ohio, Kentucky, and West Virginia. In the year 2000, the picture was in the National Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. The Schoenstatt Movement has brought the Picture of Grace to its' annual weekend retreats at the Spiritual Center of Maria Stein and was one of the first groups to reserve the center when it reopened. On September 21, 2014, Fr. Gerold Langsch officiated as the Picture of Grace was enthroned in the chapel at the Spiritual Center of Marie Stein as a source of inspiration and grace.

"In our self-centered culture and classic American emphasis on work, we often feel we have to accomplish something during our times of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. We rate our experience by how 'good' our prayer was, how heartfelt our devotion was, or how focused we could remain. Yet prayer and contemplation are fundamentally God's work, in which we are invited to participate. We need only to give Him the opening, and He will do the rest. By coming to adoration, we are handing Him the keys to our hearts, allowing the rays of His love and grace to bathe our souls in the light of His Presence, as the rays of the sun bathe our bodies in light. If we can take the time to pull away from the busyness and distractions of life and just sit at His feet, He will lead us."


