Message from the Pastor

Summer time is finally here. Not that I'm happy that sweat has returned to my daily life, but it is a nice time when days are longer, when the sun is shining more, when there's no school and things aren't as hectic around here, and when the barbeque grill is at work and the adult beverages are ice cold.

This summer I will be able to go on a little vacation in Florida at the end of June and get a little continuing education in Baltimore at a 3-day course for priests on preaching.

On my way back from Florida I will be attending the 25th anniversary of my cousin, Sister Mary John Slonkosky, as a Dominican Sister of Nashville. Back in 1991, she made her first vows and has been a faithful consecrated sister ever since. Her order, the Nashville Dominicans of St. Cecilia, are a teaching order of nuns. Sister Mary John has worked around the country in various schools, including a stint in New Orleans right before hurricane Katrina, in Greenville, South Carolina, and in Virginia Beach, Virginia, as a school principal, where she is today.

An interesting note, she was born in 1964, as was I and our cousin Father Ned Brown (currently the pastor at Fort Recovery). On our mom's side of the family there were 96 first cousins. Only those born consecutively in 1964 (numbers 71, 72 and 73 of the 96) have gone on to serve the Church as a priest or religious. Must have been something about 1964 I guess. More than the year, it was our families' great faith and love for the Church, especially that of our grandma, Neoma Wetzel, and our parents, George and Mary Brown, John and Marge Slonkosky, and Jim and Evonne Stechschulte.

Vocations are a gift from God and He calls whom He chooses. But the fertile seedbed of a faithful Catholic family helps nurture that call from God and bring it to fruition. I owe a lot to my family's faith and I thank God that I had the grace to grow up in such a family and be able to follow my priestly vocation. I'm sure Sister Mary John and Father Ned feel the same way.

So, families of Holy Rosary and St. Patrick's, keep practicing your Catholic faith. Keep nourishing your children with prayer and the sacraments. God is calling many of them to become priests and religious sisters. Make sure they all have an opportunity to hear that call and follow it.

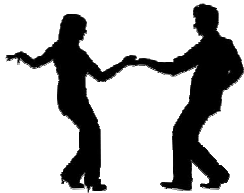

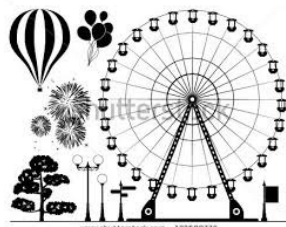
