Message from the Pastor

I have been attending the bible study on Tuesday nights. This fall we are taking a close look at the Letter of St. James. It is fascinating to read so much into such a short letter to Jewish Catholic converts of the first century, by a man who knew Jesus personally. When Todd Spieles, the parishioner who has facilitated and led the bible study groups for the past few years, told me about this year's study, he said it has a lot of "homily material" in it. He was right. But more than that, it has a lot of insights and inspirations into my own spiritual life and relationship to Christ. I am getting a lot out of the bible study and now wish that I had made time for it in the past.

So what are you doing Tuesday nights in October? The bible study is a great way to spend your evening each week and to really grow in wisdom and grace through the Scriptures. The program is great – you read a short passage from the Letter of St. James; then you use the questions in the workbook to get the most out of your reading. At the study we exchange answers to the questions and then watch a presentation by Jeff Cavins on that same passage. He is an expert biblical scholar who is humble and has a good sense of humor. To help hold your attention, in the workbook there are headings relevant to what he is talking about and spaces to take notes during the presentation. It's really a fantastic way for the Bible to be opened up to you. I highly recommend you come for the bible studies on Tuesdays. You can jump right in and just do a little catch up. But you will get a lot out of it if you do. See you next Tuesday!

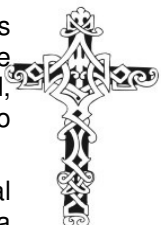
Virtue of the month: Humility
