## Message from the Pastor

We have had a slew of baptisms lately. That is very good. We are definitely a "Pro-Life" parish. Thank you to all who brought new life in the world and accepted your child lovingly from God and brought them forward for the Sacrament of Baptism.

The neat thing is that we are a "Pro-Eternal Life" parish as well. In baptism we give the gift of eternal life to our children, the greatest gift ever. Baptism is the first of the 7 Sacraments which opens the door to the rest. Baptism gives a person sanctifying grace, the purifying bath which cleanses original sin and makes them children of God and members of the Mystical Body of Christ. Through baptism we have an eternal destiny with God in Heaven...if we are faithful to Him.

Baptism is a necessary sacrament. Every individual person on the face of the earth ought to be baptized. Christ gave his life for this gift. He wants us all to be one with him, freed from sin and living in God's grace. Baptism is the way to do this. Since we all at birth are under the domain of original sin, the sin of our first parents, Adam and Eve, we all need the healing and creative effect of baptism to free us and give us a share in God's life.

Does this mean that an unbaptized person doesn't share in God's life and thereby won't get to Heaven? Didn't Jesus say that unless you are born again (baptized) you will not enter the Kingdom of Heaven (John 3:3)? An unbaptized person, if he does not know of Christ and the Church, can reach Heaven if he is faithful to his conscience. That person in effect has unconsciously accepted baptism, a baptism of desire so to speak. Such a person would probably accept baptism if he was introduced to it. A person who has been introduced to Christ and offered baptism but does not accept it, has a harder chance of getting to Heaven.

That's why the Church has always sent missionaries into the unchurched world, to make known the message of salvation in Christ and offer baptism to everyone. That's why we have to become missionaries right here in our community, to bring the gift of God's life and union with Him to everyone around us. So if a coworker or relative or even a spouse is not baptized, start up the conversation with them and let them know the truth and beauty of baptism and belief in Christ. *Fr. Barry*
