### **Message from the Pastor**

Following up on a previous report on the status of the building renovation project at Holy Rosary, things are moving right along. You've seen the entrance way all torn up and down; and the modular buildings gone. I told you it would be getting serious for us and I thank you for your patience in working around all the mess. I admit, when I first saw the back entrance all ripped out, I was a little shocked. But things are moving right along.

Later this month, we will be holding Sunday Mass services in the church basement, so that they can lay the new flooring in church and install the new pews. Again, sorry for the inconvenience. It may be 2 to 3 Sundays downstairs.

The new adoration chapel is in full use now and what a wonderful place to pray before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Having the Sacred Host visible in the monstrance is a special grace for anyone who visits. See the bulletin or call the office to sign up for a specific hour to pray each week. The stained-glass windows for the chapel are due at the end of January.

So, with all this work being done we really need to get those pledges in as soon as possible. We took out a loan for the outstanding balance. The earlier the pledges are in the less interest we will have to pay. So, keep your pledges coming in. If you haven't yet made a payment, you may be receiving a little friendly reminder in the mail. Thank you for your support of the whole project.

At St. Patrick's, you will have seen the new entrance, including the restored stained-glass window above the new doors to church. It is an amazing new look coming into church. Next of course, is the repair and conservation of the rest of the stained-glass windows in church. We have received several donations for this project, but we need a little more. Please consider a gift towards this necessary project. Memorial gifts in your family's name or in memory of a loved one of \$6,000 or \$12,000 for a half or full window restoration can be made. All donations over \$1,000 will be noted on a special plaque in church.

May God continue to bless our work for His Kingdom here at our parishes, and may He bless each and every one of you and your families in a special way this new year.
