Message from the Pastor

I was straightening up my office the other day, cleaning out my file drawers, arranging things on my book shelf, etc., when I came across a little booklet entitled "The Wonders of the Universe". It was subtitled, "A Special Collection of Quotations From Great Minds Throughout History". I don't remember where I picked it up. There was no other information in it, just the quotes.

The first quote was from Abraham Lincoln. It read, "I can see how it might be possible for a man to look down upon earth and be an atheist, but I cannot conceive how he could look up into the heavens and say there is no God."

We can look to earth, meaning we can seek scientific explanations for everything that is around us and give a reason like evolution to find the answer to how everything exists the way it does today. But when we look into the heavens, in other words, when we look for the "why" of everything, we cannot help but say that God exists and He is the reason behind everything.

But also, when we gaze into the heavens, into the sky on a clear, starry night, we ask ourselves why this enormous universe, full of celestial bodies, supernovas, suns and planets, is here before our eyes? Minutes of the Holy Rosary Pastoral Council – May 23, 2017

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Bob Kantner with prayers.

Members present: Elaine Paul, Charlotte Duncan, Bob Kantner, Robbie Burke, Pam Rammel, Matt Kinkley, Jim Schloemer, Peg Larkin and Al Meinerding. Fr. Barry, Deacon Marty, Joe Kuebler and Lil Heitkamp were also present. Kelly Wilker was excused.

There was one correction to the March minutes regarding the seating capacity in the church.

Altar Society – Lil Heitkamp reported that May Crowning went very well. The meeting on May 16th was well attended. Invitations were sent out for this meeting. Ruth Oen asked for volunteers to help with the Cancer fundraiser. Verlene Lawler has received help making baptismal cloths. The reception for Fr. Alex Witt was very well attended. Connie Miley is heading a Lady of Fatima Statue project which is coming to Holy Rosary on August 25. The next meeting will be in September and Debbie Stegall will take over as President.

Knights of Columbus – Joe Kuebler reported Fr. Alex Witt was very thankful for all the donations and the chalice he received. Several donations to seminarians have been made from the Fr. Byrne Fund. New members are always welcome – practicing Catholic men, 18 years old and older. Please visit the Council website, KofC1592.org.

Youth Ministry (CONNECT) – No report.

Education/School – Robbie Burke reported for Lora Krugh. Eight – 8th graders received their diplomas on May 21, at 8:00am Mass, with a reception that followed. Enrollment is positive: 17 are in kindergarten; Pre-K is almost full; lost 3 from Grade 5 going into Grade 6. This is a trend with our new middle school. Holy Rosary is now an autism scholarship provider. All children now in the program list Holy Rosary as their primary provider. We have set up tuition for a full ABLE (Academic and Behavioral Learning Environment) as well as a fee schedule for a child who can handle the general education classroom with supports. All parish and school employees participated in a Rescue Task Force training on Monday, May 22. This involved real life scenario of an active shooter, with EMS, city, county law enforcement attending. St. Marys City Schools are very helpful in getting us items for our emergency response kits. All teachers are coming back next year. We have added two teachers and two aides who will be paid by the autism scholarship, at no cost to Holy Rosary. The school building is in need of a new PA system. This issue will be brought up to the finance committee.

Religious Education – Robbie Burke reported for Nan Mielke. CCD is complete for the year. 34 children received their First Holy Communion on May 7th. May Crowning was held on May 3rd and was well attended especially by young families. Little Flowers and Conquest have concluded for the year and will resume in the fall. Girls Club will have two meetings, on June 28th and July 26th, for the girls incoming 4th-8th grade to attend Mass, have lunch, play games and do some service work at Agape. CONNECT (HRYG) will have a “Nun Run” and trip to the seminary this summer. CONNECT is sponsoring the reception for the MHS graduates after 8:00am Mass on May 28th. Nan is attending a meeting on Catechism Certification to learn about changes for next year. The Archbishop is implementing a new program called the Catechetical Institute. This program will insure all Catechists have ongoing discipleship formation. “Biblical Walk thru the Mass” began May 10th and is running on consecutive Wednesday evenings. “33 Days to Morning Glory” will begin in June at St. Patrick’s; a repeat of a popular study. Vacation Bible School forms are available and will be held July 9-13, from 6-8pm, in the school. October 29, 2017 is a Confirmation retreat with NET Ministries. Confirmation will be on November 19, 2017, and will have 29 students being confirmed from Holy Rosary and three from St. Patrick’s.

Maintenance – Deacon Marty reported Joyce Gossard and Max Travis will be summer help. Plumbing issues in the church basement bathrooms have been addressed. The ladies restroom in the basement and the cry room need painted. Marty is waiting on the teachers’ wish lists of things they need done in their classrooms. Weststaff has donated some furniture for the basement classrooms and the Upper Room.

Finance Committee – Fr. Barry reported the teacher salaries will increase 1%. The autism school provides 6 full tuitions. Sixty-one percent of the capital campaign money has been collected and the first interest payment paid. We still need at least a 91% return on the pledges to cover the total cost of the project.

Liturgy Board – There was not a meeting but Fr. Barry asked for feedback from Easter.

Update on the building project: Deacon Marty reported Phase 3 – the church / school connector is underway. The project will be complete in approximately 3 weeks from now. Twelve new spots were gained by repaving lines on the parking lot.

New Business: There is a new program for couples wanting to marry in the church. It involves couple shadowing. The program needs further discussion and feedback before any decision will be made. The parish festival committee is seeking volunteers to help in the tents/ booths. Please refer to the bulletin and volunteer. Bingo during the festival will be held in the church basement.

Pastors Report – The Autism clinic is ours – it belongs to Holy Rosary. It is being run by Mrs. Gwen Bergman. It covers students in grades K-8. Ordination of Fr. Alex Witt was very special. He celebrated his first Mass here at Holy Rosary this past Sunday. Seminarian Ambrose Dobrozi will be leaving at the end of May. He is thankful for his year of formation here. Holy Rosary will welcome a new seminarian in August. All teachers signed contracts to return next year. It was mentioned tours of the church might be given at predetermined times during the festival.

Next meeting will be held on August 22nd, 2017 at 7:00 pm in the Upper Room.
