Message from the Pastor

This past week I was just outside of Wheeling, West Virginia, for a four-day continuing education workshop entitled, A Living Sacrifice: The Priesthood in Scripture. It was very informative and spiritually uplifting. This was sponsored by the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology. We heard talks by some great theologians, including Scott Hahn, a famous convert to Catholicism and a renowned Catholic author and speaker. He wrote the book, *The Lamb's Supper*, one of the most meaningful and helpful books on the Sacrifice of the Mass, a must-read.

Every year each priest from our archdiocese is supposed do a week of continuing education as a part of their ongoing formation. I'm glad I got the opportunity to do this, especially this summer. The week was very prayerful and reawakened the true sense of my vocation, rooted in Sacred Scripture.

Catholics always get criticized for not knowing the Bible well enough. The truth is we Catholics hear more of the Scriptures during the three-year cycle of readings at Mass than most Protestants. Many of the Protestants ministers simply preach from Scripture passages that they like. At Catholic services, we hear a full range of readings, especially from the Gospels. Of the New Testament, we hear 71.5% of it, with nearly 90% of the Gospels and over half of the New Testament Letters. So, even if you don't know chapter and verse, you have heard a good part of the Word of God proclaimed to you each week – and that is very good.

So, keep listening well to the Word of God read at Mass. And when the homily doesn't hit you, just reflect on a phrase or an image from the readings and let the Holy Spirit inspire you with a message for your life. Later in the day, think back on that phrase or image and bring it into your prayer. It will help you grow spiritually and get you through any difficulty.

I want to thank all the readers at Masses who do such a good job of proclaiming the Word. They are an invaluable part of the Liturgy and I thank God for their talent and their generosity in serving our parishes.
