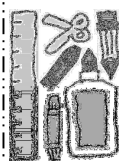

Message from the Pastor

Something that keeps me going during the summer months is being able to offer the Mass on weekdays and the fervent and prayerful people who are with me each day as we offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Blessed Pope Paul VI said in his encyclical letter, *Mysterium Fidei* (The Mystery of Faith), that the faithful in large numbers should take an active part in the Sacrifice of the Mass each and every day, receive the nourishment of Holy Communion and thank Christ for such a great a gift.

I really appreciate having a good number of parishioners present with me as I offer Mass each day. In my little homily for the day I try to give a little spiritual boost to the people. I kind of like giving the daily Mass homily better than on Sunday, because I can be a little more spontaneous and connect to the people at those Masses. I hope that I do and that they get that daily spiritual nourishment they need.

It's also neat to get into the rhythm of the daily readings; following along one book of the Bible for an extended time. I also like when we celebrate the feast day of a saint. Their stories are always fascinating and can be very encouraging for us sinners who are struggling along in our spiritual lives. I wish we had more saints' days on Sundays for the whole parish to experience.

So, if you are looking for a way to grow in your faith and to get closer to God between Sundays; give daily Mass a try. Maybe start with one day a week if you can. On Wednesdays, the daily Mass is at noon. It might be a good lunch break for you. If you can't make it during the week, once a month on the first Saturday, we also have Mass in memory of our Blessed Mother Mary. I hope to see you during the week at church. If you can't make it, know that you are in my prayers every day. God bless!

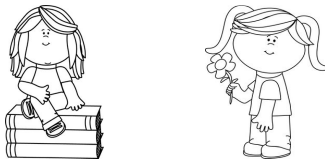
