Life Skills at HRS

Students are using a program called Skills Streaming by Ellen McGinnis this school year. If a teacher asks a child, "Are you using Skill 8," a child should be able to respond what Skill 8 is. By the way, Skill 8 is Offering Help to an Adult. Each morning for 30 days, teachers are "teaching" a skill, through discussion and modeling, and then that skill is used throughout the school year.

Skills are divided by category. Thus far, students have learned several Classroom Survival Skills, such as listening, ignoring distractions, and how to ask for help. We are also working on skills in making friends, dealing with feelings, and problem-solving. Who doesn't need these skills?? We all do, students and adults alike. Parents are encouraged to practice these skills at home, too.

Stop in sometime and check out how far we are in relearning some of the skills necessary to survive in today's world. We've posted them on the upper and the lower floor to help us remember. Of utmost importance in life are Skill #1 and Skill #4. If you want to know what these two are, ask a Holy Rosary School student!
