I will be going on retreat next week. I am going down to a retreat house of the Dominican Sisters of Nashville called the Bethany House in western Tennessee.

Have you been on a retreat lately? A few days off to be away with the Lord? A few days of quiet and prayer? A few days to collect your thoughts and have that long talk with God that you sorely need?

A yearly spiritual retreat used to be common practice in Catholic circles. I started going on retreats in high school and kept it up each year to this day. I strongly encourage each one of you to look into doing a retreat soon. It can make a big difference in your life.
