Message from the Pastor

I turned 53 this past week. Thanks for all the 'Happy Birthdays' and prayers. I had a great week on retreat and prayed a lot for all of you.

My real birthday will be next week, October 23rd. It was on that day, back in 1964, in the small vestibule of St. Augustine's parish church in Minster, Ohio, that I was held over the font and was washed clean of sin and born again – a new birth to everlasting life.

So, I'm a "born again Christian". All of us who were baptized are born again. Our fallen human nature, tainted by original sin, has been remade, regenerated, renewed, by the waters of baptism. In the Sacrament of Baptism, the action of Christ through the Church effects this wonderful thing. Baptism is the essential sacrament; the one which enables us to receive all the others. It is the necessary Sacrament, which opens the gates to Heaven for us. Jesus himself said that if you are not born again you will not enter the Kingdom of God.

Baptism is a supernatural grace (the gift of adoption into God's family and salvation) manifested in the outward sign of pouring water over a person while pronouncing the formula: "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." This grace can be forfeited, however, through mortal sin and denying God his rightful due. Not everyone who is baptized is saved...but it's not God's fault. He is faithful, but He made us free to accept and live by the grace received in baptism.

So being baptized is a critically important thing in everyone's life. You might say that your eternity depends on it. It's something to be very thankful for.

If you know someone who is not baptized, or has not baptized their children, say something to them; invite them and encourage them to take instruction in the Faith and be baptized. It would be the greatest gift you could give a person.

Minutes of the Holy Rosary Pastoral Council – September 26, 2017

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Bob Kantner with prayers.

Members present - Elaine Paul, Bob Kantner, Robbie Burke, Pam Rammel, Matt Kinkley, Jim Schloemer, Peg Larkin, Charlotte Duncan and Al Meinerding. Fr. Barry, Lil Heitkamp and Deb Stegall were also present. Deacon Marty was excused.

The minutes for the August meeting were approved.

Altar Society – Lil Heitkamp reported Deb Stegall is the new President. Six home baked items were donated to the Heritage Days event at Maria Stein. The Mass for 25, 50 and 60th wedding anniversaries was well attended. October 6th is the Interfaith brunch at Otterbein. October 17th is the next meeting where Seminarian Michael Mazzei will be the guest speaker. The fall bake sale will be on November 3rd. Fellowship Sunday for the Altar Society will be in February.

Knights of Columbus – No report, however new members are always welcome – practicing Catholic men, 18 years old and older. Please visit the Council website, KofC1592.org or Facebook page. Fr. James O. Byrne Council #1592.

Youth Ministry (CONNECT) – No report.

Education Commission – Robbie Burke reported for Education Commission. “Lunch with Moms” was well attended on September 21st. A donation of \$300 was gratefully received from our Knights of Columbus. There will be an October celebration of Our Lady of the Rosary with Mr. Mazzei planning a rosary service with our students. Right to Read Week, parent/teacher conferences, Special Relative Day and the Saints Parade are all coming up in October. VOCARE Convocation was attended by 4 day school catechists. Officer Boos, our school resource officer, is holding the first of monthly safety meeting for the student body. These are held the last Tuesday of each month.

Robbie also reported that CCD began on September 6th for grades 7-12 from 7-8pm. Second grade will take up offertory on the 1st Sunday of each month at the 11 a.m. Mass beginning in October. Other grades will take up the offertory on the 2nd Sunday of the month. Sunday School began September 17th during the 11 a.m. Mass for 3 year olds through public kindergarten. Vocare is the program being adopted by the Archdiocese to offer the opportunity for all Catechists to become certified to teach in the Archdiocese. Six CCD Catechists attended Convocation with the Archbishop where the focus was on Vocare...how to use it and the importance of continuing education. The Archdiocese is doing a new Marriage Prep – which our parish is adopting. The program will be called *Fully Engaged*. It will involve mentor couples meeting more often with engaged couples (4 times instead of 2 times). Then, the couple will receive emails for one year after their wedding in order to encourage the couple to make God central in their marriage. We continue to offer the Baptism Course for Couples when having their oldest child baptized. Fr. Barry is now attending these meetings to assist in teaching and being present to get to know the parents. Our parishes have renewed our FORMED subscription in order to help bring Christ into the home. We have about 100 parishioners that have signed up (that's Holy Rosary and St. Patrick's combined). Our high school students and RCIA will use various studies on FORMED.

Maintenance – Bob Kantner reported for Deacon Marty. We are continuing to work on the landscaping as the Fall is a better time for planting. There are continued conversations with Beam Construction to resolve the bell tower issues. Quotes are also being gathered to replace the public address system in the school so that all areas of our campus can be included in special announcements which will improve the safety of everyone. We are working to reinstall the basketball poles and paint the kids games like 4 square, kickball and hopscotch back onto the blacktop. Our school year is off to a good start with only a few minor drainage issues that needed unclogged. The new cleaning schedules are working out well. Pieces of steel belts were found in the new tire mulch around the playground equipment. The company responsible will be raking the mulch with magnets to remove the undesirable pieces. At the cemetery, there are six foundations to install, the drives need sprayed and leveled, and pavers will be placed around the new columbarium and the walkway leading to it. We plan to install a stone edging around the crucifix to make the flower bed look even nicer.

Finance Committee – Fr. Barry reported collections are down \$2,500 from June-September. *Parishpay* has been bought by LPI and now will be called *WeShare*. Nothing will change other than the name and that takes place on October 9th. Final payments for the construction project will be made to Ferguson in September. Our final interest payment on the construction loan will be November 2017. Regular payments on our loan will begin in May 2018. We have collected 65% of our pledges. We are getting quotes on new PA system and phone system in the school.

Liturgy Board – Fr. Barry said there was not a meeting.

Old Business — In October, there will be two informational sessions on the new marriage prep course. Our parish is looking for mentor couples.

New Business — Fr. Barry reported the PTO is very vibrant this year, with a lot of good ideas. The Church Open House will be on October 7th and 8th after the Masses. There will be tours of the chapel, the Upper Room and basement classrooms. Snacks will follow each Mass in the cafeteria.

Pastors Report – Fr. Barry reported he would like to perform a rededication of our church on June 24, 2019, and invite the Bishop. That date will mark 40 years since the dedication.

Next meeting will be held on October 24th, 2017, at 7:00 pm.
