Message from the Pastor

Do you think our young people are going about dating in the right way? I'm not so sure. I want you to share this message with your children and grandchildren who are beginning the magical time of discovering the opposite sex and are ready to date.

I think maybe our unmarried young people are "dating" only because they have gotten closer physically to another person (or want to get close). Of course, you don't usually want to go out with someone you are not physically attracted to. But if that's the only thing you are basing your dating on, it usually ends in heartbreak or worse. How many of us have had the experience of "falling in love" with the girl or guy of our dreams, then falling out of love when we realized that we had little in common, only a common physical attraction. How many marriages have failed because a true interpersonal relationship was not formed while dating and it was all about sex?

First off, there are different types of dates. Group dates can be a good means of discovering the opposite sex in a safe environment. Kids learn how to talk to and interact with others. Parents need to coach them about how they should act when out with a group of friends of both genders.

Then there is the solo couple date with two people who want to get to know each other better. This can be a casual, non-committal occasion, or it can be a discerning moment where they are looking for a future spouse. Of course, age is a factor here. I don't agree with high school aged kids dating in this way or "going steady". They are not prepared for the consequences of a relationship.

A couple who dates exclusively should have the possibility of marriage in their sights. They should develop a lasting friendship first and keep things in the right order, with a growing respect for the other, the one who could be their future spouse. If you can't be faithful and chaste with someone you are dating, what will it be like after you are married. Premarital sex is the road to extra marital sex (adultery).

A suggestion for a couple who are dating: why not pray together before or after a date? Maybe they could go to church together before a Saturday night out on the town. And how about this novel idea – an adoration date – spending some time together in the adoration chapel, praying for each other with Christ at the center of the date. Wouldn't that change the way a relationship went?

We need to change the way our kids approach dating. Parents need to talk to them about it more. A future of a happy married life starts with the preparation of a good dating relationship. *Fr. Barry*
