Message from the Pastor

I have often wondered where I'd be without the Catholic Faith. I have a hard time understanding people who can live without faith, indifferent to God, with other concerns on their mind. How can a person live and not realize with great humility that he was created, that there is more to this world than what we see and feel, that God does indeed exist, and we are made to know, love and serve Him in this world and to enjoy being with Him in the next? How can a person be oblivious to these great truths of life and death, and eternity? Whenever I encounter someone who just doesn't get it, I want to shake them and look them in the eye and shout to them, "Don't you want to be saved?!"

I guess if you live your life outside the realm of faith in God and these eternal truths, you can get along in life, and even enjoy it to some extent. The problem is meaning. My most profound prayer is that each and every one of the parishioners at Holy Rosary and St. Patrick's, especially those who are indifferent to God, or running from God behind the things of this world, may realize the tremendous satisfaction of a life lived with faith and a faith that is put into practice day by day, week by week, Sunday after Sunday.

Minutes of the Holy Rosary Pastoral Council – October 24, 2017

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Bob Kantner with prayers.

Members present: Elaine Paul, Bob Kantner, Robbie Burke, Pam Rammel, Matt Kinkley, Jim Schloemer, Peg Larkin, Charlotte Duncan and Al Meinerding. Fr. Barry, Lil Heitkamp, Debbie Stegall and Joanna Frankenberg were also present. Deacon Marty was excused.

The minutes for the September meeting were approved.

Altar Society – Debbie Stegall reported there were 17 ladies who attended their last meeting where Michael Mazzei was the guest speaker. To make the Altar Society more visible, they will be setting up a table in the vestibule after several of the Masses. Teresa Vint sent a thank you note regarding the baked items we donated to the Heritage Days event at Maria Stein. The Interfaith breakfast was a success. There were approximately 75-80 attendees. Fr. Barry asked us to look into restoring the Our Lady of the Rosary painting which hangs on the north wall of the church. Connie Miley volunteered to do research. Robbie Burke volunteered to work with Fr. Barry, Jess and Patti to put together a welcome package and letter for new parishioners. The annual fall bake sale will be on Friday, November 3. Next meeting will be November 21st. Sue Halko will be the guest speaker sharing updates from the funeral committee.

Knights of Columbus – Joe Kuebler reported they have been working with the Family Life Center (FLC), The Archdiocese of Cincinnati and our Supreme Council (the highest of K of C) on a project to help FLC purchase a portable ultrasound unit. At this point, they have all the approvals, and will soon be launching a fundraising campaign to raise our local share. Their share will be matched by their Supreme Council through the K of C Ultrasound Initiative program. The total project will probably exceed \$20,000. In addition to the Council and Parish, they intend to solicit support from neighboring K of C Councils, neighboring churches, community organizations and the general public. The K of C recently made the following donations: \$100 to Equestrian Therapy, \$100 to ROC, \$100 to Archdiocesan Matching Funds Campaign for Catholic Education, \$80 to Rider Rooters for program ad and \$500 from our Vocation Fund to Michael Mazzei. The Football Frenzy ticket campaign is almost complete and has been very successful. New members are always welcome – practicing Catholic men, 18 years old and older. Youth Ministry (CONNECT) – Joanna Frankenberg reported they finished the One Warm Coat Drive for Agape and it was a success. NET Ministries Retreat is from 9a-5p on October 29th. There will be an IHOP Holy Hour before Thanksgiving and there is discussion of a Lock-In around Christmas.

Education Commission – Field trips this Fall have been wonderful from farms to symphonies; older grades are going on a three-day trip to Camp Wilson soon. Our Lady of the Rosary feast day was celebrated with a rosary built on the wall in the gym with all students taking part. Right to Read Week will be celebrated next week with All Saints Day. Special relatives are invited on November 1st for Mass, a tour of the school and activities, followed by the Saints Parade at 9:30am. Safety meetings are going very well with Officer Boos in charge. Library books are being donated by a lady in New York. Vocation Awareness Week is November 5-11. Jennifer Bayham, a HR graduate, is invited in to talk about her Sister Cities trip to Japan. Ally Moore, another graduate of HR, came in to talk about her basic training with the National Guard. Teachers are beginning their work in the Vocare process, a new catechetical certification process. October's Virtue of the Month is faith, highlighting St Francis of Assisi. November is Kindness with St. Andrew. The school's annual daily membership count as of the first week of October was 139 students in K-8. There are 25 in Pre-K right now, with three more joining throughout the year for a full 28, which is the most we can have. Of the 139 in K-8, 124 are Catholic and 15 are Non-Catholic.

CCD prayed the Rosary for the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary last week with the 8th grade leading. We are emphasizing the importance of weekly Mass attendance, prayer within the home and proper behavior/respect in church. 2nd grade will take up offertory on the 1st Sunday of the month at the 11 a.m. Mass beginning in October – May. First grade does the offertory on the 2nd Sunday of the month. Sunday School is every other Sunday. Conquest had their Father/Son Camp Out last week. 36 boys registered K-high school with anticipation of more after fall sports wrap up. Little Flowers served at the Open House this past Sunday. 17 girls are registered K-3rd. We are looking to resume the afterschool girls club for older girls – in November on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Wednesdays of the month. We will begin right after school. Youth Group's One warm Coat Drive for Agape wrapped up. We began a LIFE Group will all 7th-12th Graders taking place the last Wednesday of the month during CCD. We had Connie McEldowney from Rustic Hope speak with the students. Kids brought in donations of toiletries, diapers and wipes to thank her. This month the ROC is coming to speak about their mission in town. Carol Katter is organizing the activities and speakers.

RCIA is on Thursday nights 7pm-8:30pm in the Upper Room and Tuesdays at 9:15am. We continue with 5-7 adults who are inquiring. Other Adult Faith studies- Adult Faith of the Ephesians, Wisdom and Works of Mercy and Women's Bible Studies – at Holy Rosary on Tuesdays after the 8:15 Mass – are all well attended. Confirmation date is November 19th at the 11 a.m. Mass (9th grade will be confirmed). NET Ministries will be conducting the high school and Confirmation retreats and it will include 8th graders this year on Sunday, October 29th.

The Archbishop gave a talk at the Vocare Convocation emphasizing the urgent need of all to learn and live their Catholic faith. For every 1 Catholic who joins the church, 6 leave. Only 30% of Americans raised Catholic are still practicing their faith. Less than 22% of Americans attend Mass weekly. More than 45% of Catholics in America do not know about the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. More than 40% of Catholics in America do not believe in a personal God.

Maintenance – Fr. Barry reported for Deacon Marty. The landscaping around our campus is done. We are still working with Ferguson to install a canopy over the Pine St. entrance to church. An air damper was installed in the cry room to make it more comfortable.

Finance Committee – Fr. Barry reported collections for the month of October are looking within budget. We received one quote for the PA and phone system for the school at a cost of \$15,000. We are working on a security grant to help cover that cost. 65% of our pledges have been paid toward the capital campaign as of September 25.

Liturgy Board – Fr. Barry said the next meeting will be November 6th.

Old Business - Fr. Barry reported that Deacon Marty installed the basketball hoops on the playground. A second visit is in order to address the pieces of steel belts that were found in the new tire mulch around the playground equipment. The company responsible will be raking the mulch with larger magnets to remove the undesirable pieces during the second visit. The wire moldings in the church for the fire alarms have been painted.

Open agenda - Pastoral Council election in November if all goes as planned. Give names of those interested in being on council to Matt Kinkley or Bob Kantner.

New Business - Fr. Barry reported the new marriage prep course is called Witness to Love. Pre-Cana is now a retreat. The former FOCCUS is now called Fully Engaged.

Pastors Report – Fr. Barry discussed the Masses for Christmas and New Years Day since they both fall on Mondays.
