Message from the Pastor

I hope you are all ready to go on retreat this Lent, on Sunday afternoons beginning February 25 or Tuesday nights beginning February 20th. I don't want you to miss this excellent spiritual boost that FORMED.org has provided for us. This is a very well-done series with great Catholic speakers and moving testimonies of how God's mercy can affect our lives for the better. We all need to experience the love and mercy of God which He shows us in the Sacrament of Confession. If you go to Confession regularly, this will only deepen your understanding of this sacrament and maybe get you out of some of the routine of going to Confession.

But really, this series is for you who don't get to Confession as often as you should, or who haven't been there in a while. This retreat will be an eye opener and maybe a tear jerker as well, once your eyes are opened to the great love and mercy God has for you and its transforming power. So, be brave and come to our parish retreat. It will be a life-changing Lent for you if you do. I encourage everyone to make the effort to attend this retreat. Even if you can only make it for one session, each video is stand alone and can help you tremendously.

All this is designed to gain a deeper desire for a higher level of holiness and a closer relationship to God. My hope is that Holy Week finds you more engaged with your faith, with the consolation of knowing that God loves you and wants the best for you. It will all culminate on Divine Mercy Sunday (the Sunday after Easter) when we will have a special holy hour at church to thank Jesus for his and sacrificial love for us out of the mercy of his heart.

There is a lot at stake here – your eternal salvation. No small thing. So, let's all make the effort to inform ourselves on our Catholic Faith and let ourselves be inspired by the transforming mercy available to us in the Sacrament of Confession. See you in the Church basement on Tuesday, February 20th or Sunday, February 25th.

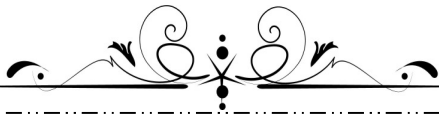

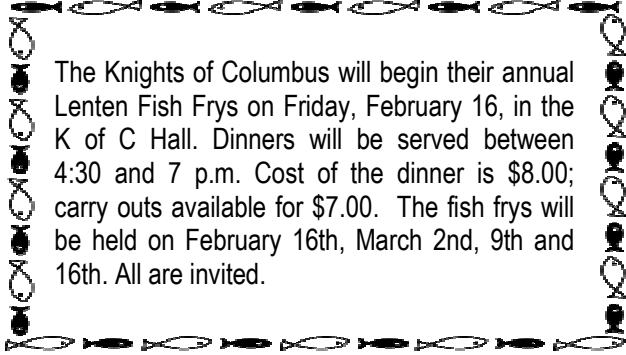

The Church asks us to observe fasting and abstinence on **Ash Wednesday & Good Friday**



Abstinence means not eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent.

The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds Catholics from ages 18 to 59.

Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal and two smaller, penitential meals (example: bread and water) on a given fast day, with no in between snacks.
