## Have You Ever Wonder What An *Indulgence* Is?

I'll use this analogy: Lucy is a kind student. She helps at her church and volunteers at the soup kitchen. Her teachers think she is wonderful. Lucy's classmate, Sally, is jealous of Lucy. Sally makes up a lie and gives Lucy a bad reputation by telling all her friends. Rumors spread. Later on Sally realizes she's made a mistake and goes to Reconciliation. Sally is forgiven, but there are still the consequences. Not only do Sally's friends look down on Lucy, but Sally's friends have now shared Sally's lie with their friends, families, and the like. Sin is the same way.

When we turn away from God, we go to confession to ask Him to forgive the wrongs we have done. Truly sorry for our faults, God forgives us. However, our sins still have consequences. Sin affects us three ways: personally, our relationship with God, and others. Sin affects others, even if the sin isn't directed towards others, because we are all members of God's family.

God desires us to be with Him in heaven and He offers an abundance of ways to do that, ex. the sacraments, devotions, and sacramentals. Indulgences are another way that God extends His infinite love and mercy to us. They are offered to us as an aid to make up for the consequences of our sins. We can make up for our wrongs either while here on earth or in purgatory. As I was told in grade school, heaven is for those who love God 100%. Hell is for those who love God 0%. In between, even if we love God a little, purgatory is there to help purify us from all our failings so that we can love God 100% and be with Him forever in heaven. Therefore, we perform indulgences to lessen the time we spend making up for the consequences of our bad choices.

I think of indulgences as acts of charity. Whether we pray for ourselves and others, volunteer, give alms, fast, teach CCD, and the like, all are acts of charity. If we do charitable acts because we love God and neighbor, with pure heart and intention, God, who is rich in mercy, will repay us for the good we did for the greater glory of God and for the love of neighbor.
