## **Message from the Pastor**

Been reading a good book by Scott Hahn on the Sacraments of the Catholic Church. Hahn is a great biblical scholar, theologian, and a convert to the Church. In July, I will hear him speak at a conference near Wheeling, West Virginia, as part of a weeklong mini-course for priests that I'm taking for my continuing education. I went last year and loved it.

The book is called Swear to God, The Promise and Power of the Sacraments and it's the result of a staunch Calvinist seminary student who found the Sacraments boring, discovering the riches and the depth and the excitement of God's way of communicating His life to us – the Seven Sacraments of the Catholic Church.

Protestants only hold two sacraments, baptism and the Lord's Supper. They believe God works directly with individuals through the Word (the Bible) and they don't depend on ritualist ceremony to have a personal relationship with Christ. What Scott Hahn came to realize while reading through the Fathers of the Church, the early Christian thinkers (who all were Catholic, and usually saints, by the way), that the sacramental way of doing things (in other words, through physical signs and words) is God's preferred method of conveying His Grace (His Life) to individuals and groups.

You see, what many Protestant believers don't always realize is that Jesus Christ, the Word made Flesh, **is** the preeminent Sacrament; his Body (and in His Blood shed on the Cross) is the sign or the means of sharing in the Divine Life. The Seven Sacraments come out of this incarnational modus operandi, especially and foremost in the Sacrament of the Eucharist, which is Christ Himself.

These Sacraments are signs that symbolize God's action and grace. But they do it in an effective way; they give actual grace, despite the unworthiness of the minister. It isn't like a flag which symbolizes a country. When you have the flag, you don't have the country – it's just a symbol. Not so with a Sacrament. When it is performed properly, you have Jesus Christ and you receive the grace of God.

Do you realize then that every time you participate in a Sacrament you are involved in something divine? This should blow you away! We can touch the hand of God Himself whenever we receive one of the Seven Sacraments of the Church. Shouldn't it be a priority on your weekly and monthly calendar then? The Sacrament of the Eucharist on Sundays, Confession a few times a year or more, Baptism for your children, etc.

I hope this great treasure of our church comes alive in your hearts and that you rush to receive the Sacraments whenever you can.

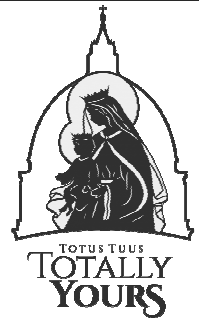
## Friendship Project at St. Patrick

## Totus Tuus Summer Camp

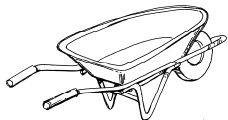
### Coming to Holy Rosary & St. Patrick!

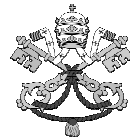
## ST. PATRICK’S VBS

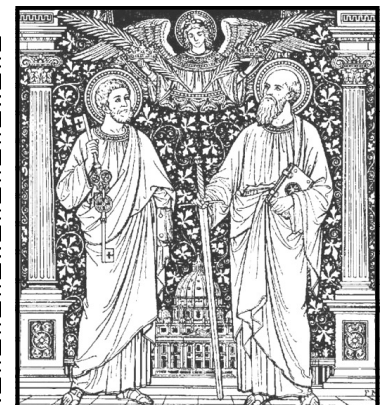

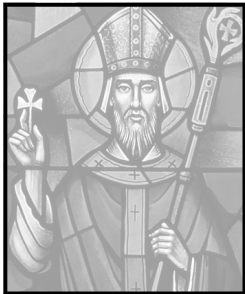
## Holy Rosary Old Church Items

**Coming This September: St. Patrick Church Interior Project Begins!**

Over the past few years, St. Patrick's has been doing a lot of renovations. We fixed the brick work two years ago and we restored the stained glass windows last year, and this Fall we will be doing a complete interior make-over including new carpet (the current carpeting is around 40 years old), repairing the ceiling plaster (it's getting pretty bad with cracks), and painting the whole interior. It's going to be a big project, **starting after September 9th** (the Sunday after the last wedding of the year). It should take around two months to complete. We will not be having Mass at St. Patrick's during this time. We will ask that parishioners attend Mass at Holy Rosary. More details to come.

June 11, 2018**

The meeting was called to order and opened with a prayer led by Kent Schlegel. Chris Knatz made a motion to accept the minutes of April 9, 2018, and Ed Poepelman seconded it.

**Old Business**

- Father stated the painting of the church by Brian Bros. will start this fall in September. It is estimated to take 2 months to repaint, refinish pews and carpet the church at an approximate cost of \$200,000. St. Patrick parishioners will be asked to attend Mass at Holy Rosary based on the Holy Rosary Mass schedule. There will be no 9:30 Mass on Sunday. Collection envelopes need to be used by St. Patrick parishioners for proper tracking. The remodeling of the sacristy will be started soon at an approximate cost of \$6000.
- Three bids for carpeting from Mel's Decorating, Roediger Custom Flooring and Tom Bice were reviewed by PC. Father prefers that we install carpeting in the entire church. Father will be contacting the three carpet bidders for new estimates based on all carpeting with the same specifications for all three.

**New Business**

- A new door has been put on the furnace room which needs to be painted. The plaque denoting all the donors to the window fund has been hung in the back of church. Window plaques for each individual window will be made once the painting of the church has been completed.
- A celebration for St. Patrick Day 2019 is being planned.
- PC looked over the 2018-2019 budget.

The meeting ended with a prayer. The next scheduled meeting will be Monday, August 13th, at 7:00 pm at the St. Patrick Rectory.
