## Message from the Pastor

Is it a mortal sin to miss Mass on Sunday? I hear this question many times in my service as a priest. As a kid I think I was told that it was. Thankfully I can count the times I have missed Mass on Sunday throughout my 53 years of life on two hands, mostly from being sick or having surgery. Even in college I went faithfully each week, going to a different parish every now and again, but mostly to Sacred Heart Parish near General Motors Institute (now Kettering University) in Fling, Michigan. Then, of course, while I was a religious brother, I went to Mass every day for eleven and a half years. I did this again when I returned to the diocesan seminary in 2004, and have gone every day since, celebrating daily Mass for the last 9 years as priest.

But the question of it being a mortal sin to miss Mass on Sunday needs a little more light shed on it. What is a mortal sin? It is a deadly sin; a thought, word or action that you freely do, that is of serious or grave matter and you know it is. You have to consciously choose to do it (accidents don't count), you have to actually do it (or think it, desire it, or say it; temptations don't count), it has to be a serious thing (lesser things are only venial sins), and you have to know it is sinful (although pleading ignorance only goes so far). A mortal sin kills the life of grace in your soul.

In the case of missing Mass on Sunday, we have to see it not as just not doing something we are told to do by a higher authority; we must see it as not fulfilling our part of a covenant or sacred bond established by God for our good. When God made the first covenant with mankind in Adam and Eve, He made a promise of His Life for us, a family bond which gives us our identity as His sons and daughters. He also gave us the sign of the covenant – Keep holy the Sabbath. For us to possess that promise of God's life in us (His grace), we must keep holy the Sabbath by worship, rest and prayer.

The Church has always taught that Keep holy the Sabbath was primarily done by attending Mass on Sunday (the new Sabbath of the New Covenant established by Christ's sacrifice on the Cross). To miss out on this is to say to God our Father, "I don't want to identify myself in your family this week...I don't want your life in me...I don't want your promise of life anymore." In doing this we cut ourselves off from the very life of God (sanctifying grace). We are as good as dead spiritually speaking. We commit a deadly sin...a mortal sin.

So, if you have skipped Mass now and again for whatever reason (vacationing, sleeping in, sport's games or practices) come to the Sacrament of Confession. Let God give you His life again, the gift of His grace. Become a faithful member of God's family again. Renew your identity as a child of God. And come to His Supper every Sunday without fail because you want to be a good son or daughter of the Most High. Make a choice to be faithful to the demands of the covenant which God offers us in His great mercy. And one day we will all be together in that great liturgy of Heaven where we will join all the angels and saints in singing God's praises for all eternity in the joy of everlasting life.



## Minutes of the Holy Rosary Pastoral Council + June 26, 2018



Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Bob Kantner with prayers .

Members present: Bob Kantner, Robbie Burke, Peg Larkin, Jim Schloemer, Pam Rammel, Deacon Marty, Joe Kuebler, Lil Heitkamp and Charlotte Duncan. Fr. Barry, Matt Kinkley, Nick Kiel and Al Meinerding were excused.

The minutes of the April 24, 2018 meeting were approved .

**Altar Society:** Lil Heitkamp reported for Debbie Stegall that the last meeting was held Tuesday, May 15, 2018. The scheduled speaker, Mary Moran, of the Island Shoppe, was unable to attend. However, Mary provided 10 summer outfits for display to give the ladies a look at new summer styles. She also provided each of the ladies with a 20% off coupon to use at the Shoppe. May Crowning on May 2<sup>nd</sup> went great. There was a nice turnout, but less than last year. Genie Evers gave an update on the purchase of rosaries. Connie Miley and Theresa Vint gave information on the Elizabeth New Life Project in Dayton. This is a faith-based organization with a "mission to empower individuals to make Godly life choices is accomplished only with the help of our community". The Center is located across the street from an abortion clinic. Elizabeth New Life Project protests outside the clinic, offers information about the abortion process, does ultrasounds and counseling. Fr. Barry has allowed Connie & Theresa to place baskets in the back of church to collect infant clothing donations.

**Knights of Columbus:** The Ultrasound Project brought in a little over \$20,000, to which the Supreme council added about \$12,000. The Family Life Center is in the process of purchasing the machine and setting it up in Wapak. The K of C will be given an opportunity to see it in action when it is ready. At their State Convention they received First Place recognition for this project. The All-Ohio Raffle Campaign was also very successful, netting about \$3,000 that will be used for charitable projects and donations.

**Youth Ministry:** No report . They are off for the summer.

**Education/School:** Robbie Burke reported for Lori Krugh and Nan Mielke. Holy Rosary had five teens attend AMPFEST on June 23 with Michael Mazzei and Stephanie Kramer. Kara Danaher attended a one day training to help lead our other teams on Saturday's AMPFEST. Three of our teens attended a week with NET Ministries at the beginning of June at the Spiritual Center. We are encouraging registrations for *Totus Tuus*, July 22-27, for 1st-12th graders. We have had a few parishioners concerned that we are not offering anything for 4 & 5 year olds, but in our attempt to encourage older children and teens to make Christ real in their lives, we have decided to try this as it was highly recommended by Fr. Alex Witt. Currently there are six people who have expressed interest in RCIA this year. We are planning for the upcoming CCD school year: confirming Catechists and recruiting those who feel called to share their faith and gifts by teaching. The Archbishop has set up an online training course for Catechists called *Vocare*; we have about 20 catechists currently in full compliance with this completing four contact hours which is very exciting for our parish.

The Education Commission election were held June 16-17, 2018, with Tracy Klosterman, Lisa Wilker & Angela Ahlers elected to the Commission. The next meeting will be September 11, 2018.

**Maintenance:** Low Voltage is running new data and phone lines. With no summer help hired this year and the busy schedule of events, projects are running behind. Shatter proof film has been applied to the school entrance doors, classrooms and office door windows. We will be seeking volunteers to help change out the vinyl fencing that was damaged in the November storm. Carpets approved at the last meeting have been installed. Saturday morning volunteers will help mulch the rectory beds and trees. Ted Vehorn will landscape the school beds and the area around the gas lines. May need to have a volunteer workday at the cemetery.

**Finance:** No report.

**Liturgy Board:** No report.

**Old Business:** The Crucifix at Gethsemane should be installed on June 27th. In July there will be an informational meeting about *The Henderson Settlement* in Kentucky regarding a September trip. There have been 2 trips to the Settlement with 2-12 trailers taking arts & crafts items and holiday decorations from the Garage Sale.

**New Business:** PC looked over 2018 Festival report: despite the weather and unfortunate set of circumstances regarding the rides, the festival netted only about \$2,000 less than last year. There has been an interest expressed in the formation of a Bereavement Ministry. Todd Spieles and Theresa Kemmann have agreed to take this on.

Archbishop Schnurr will be here August 5, 2018, to rededicate the new structures at the 11:00 Mass. A reception, similar to Corpus Christi Sunday, will follow.

Both Fr. Barry and Deacon Marty will be gone on the Italy Pilgrimage, Oct. 15-26. We will be in need of assistance with maintenance during this time period .
