Message from the Pastor

What's Heaven going to be like? That is a good question since we all want to end up there and it will be forever. What are we going to be doing all day? Are we going to be sitting on a cloud playing a harp? This comes from an image in the Bible from the Book of Revelation: "I looked...and with Him the one hundred and forty-four thousand. The sound I heard was like that of harpists playing their harps" and "Then I saw...on the sea of glass were standing those who had won the victory over the beast. They were holding God's harps." They are also pictured as singing a new song before God. So, it sounds like we better start taking harp lessons. Of course, that is only an image from the vision that St. John had. Another image from the Bible we can look at is the wedding banquet. We will be having a never-ending feast in Heaven around the table of the Lord. That would be fun, wouldn't it? However, our experience here on Earth is that we get full and tired and hungover after big dinner parties, don't we? But again, this is just an image of Heaven which points to the celebration aspect of our eternal life with God. We are going to enjoy Heaven, that's for sure.

Both of these images reveal the essence of what Heaven will be like. How? To get a glimpse of what it will be like in Heaven we look at what we do each week in church when we celebrate Mass. Each week we are gathered around the table of God (the altar) and we sing hymns before the throne (the Cross) and play music (the organ or piano are the harps) and we have a feast (the Eucharistic Bread and Wine). Therefore, where is the nearest thing to Heaven on Earth? In every Catholic church every Sunday at Mass. Heaven is the eternal sacrifice of Christ before His Father. The Mass is a new presentation of that same saving sacrifice each time a priest raises the bread and cup of wine which become the Body and Blood of Christ. So, at Mass we participate in that eternal sacrifice of praise and thanks to God. That's why we have the best music and decorate church the way we do. We want to get as close to the heavenly liturgy as we can.

And so, Heaven will be a grand show and an overwhelming celebration like no other. It will be eternal. Remember, we can't think of it as never-ending. It is a new song we sing in Heaven. In other words, it's always fresh in an everlasting moment so complete and so satisfying, that it will completely absorb us in bliss. I know it is hard to describe, but it will blow you away.

So, let's continue to offer Mass each Sunday like the Heaven it is. Feel yourself a part of a greater thing, the Divine Liturgy. Feel the presence of the angels around the altar. Most importantly, grasp the presence of Christ and unite yourself to Him more and more. Get a taste of Heaven every week at Sunday Mass and prepare yourself for the eternal liturgy and banquet of love and peace in Heaven.
