Message from the Pastor

As I mentioned in last week's homily, receiving Holy Communion is one of the greatest things you can do in this life. It is a taste of Heaven – to be united physically to your Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. And you can receive Him every day if you want; at least every week on Saturday night or Sunday morning. Wow! What a gift! Do we even realize how tremendous a thing it is to receive Jesus in the Eucharist?

There's the story of a young Chinese girl who, during the horrible persecution of the Church in the last century, saw in an abandoned, vandalized church, that the Eucharist had been thrown down on the ground, with many Hosts on the floor. So, each day she went into that church, got down on all fours on the ground, and reverently took one Host into her mouth and received it. At that time a layperson was not allowed to touch the Host with their own hands, everyone received on the tongue. She came back each day and did the same until every Host was consumed. What devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament did that girl show! What faith and adoration she demonstrated to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist! What reparation she made for so many Holy Communion made poorly without reverence or attention!

This is what I am looking for in our parishes. People who know Who they are receiving and act accordingly. People who approach the altar with eyes fixed on the Sacred Host held up before them. People who bow before their God and Lord and people say "Amen!" in a clear, audible voice and mean it – "Yes, I believe!". People who take the Host in their hand and carefully place on their tongue. And better yet, people who receive the Host on their tongue from the hand of the minister in humility, letting themselves be fed with the Bread of Angels.

Receiving the Eucharist on your tongue can be a great sign of your devotion and love of God. Doing it in this way puts your attention in the right place for the King Whom you are about to receive. When we receive in the hand, we tend to be a little more lackadaisical about what we are doing. It's too important a moment to let it go that way. I do see many receiving in their hand with reverence, and I'm not saying that is not the right way to do it. You have the choice. But, I want to encourage deeper and more reverent devotion to our Lord Jesus Christ, present in the Sacred Host by reception on the tongue. Give it a try. I think it will be a refreshing thing to allow you to slow down when coming up to Communion and better show your faith in the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. *Fr. Daney*
