### **Message from the Pastor**

How many of you have trouble sleeping at night? I have had difficulty occasionally. Sometimes I go to bed with my eyes wide open, not feeling any drowsiness. I hate it when that happens. I dread having to get up early and not having gotten many hours of sleep. Being a "night owl" I can get into trouble doing a lot of busy work at night, like sorting through drawers or rearranging things in cupboards (one night I read through all my yearbooks from high school and college); or sorting things at my desk, or just cleaning around the rectory. Mostly I stay up and watch reruns on the History Channel or Food Network. Sometimes I just sit and change the channels, catching glimpses of movies I've already seen or getting mad again at the cable news shows. Eventually I'll force myself to bed and fall asleep.

The other night I was feeling that way. So, I got out of bed and walked over to church. The rectory is attached to the church, so I don't have to go outside at all to get there; I just walk a few steps and I'm in. Being in my slippers I didn't feel right going into the adoration chapel for some reason, so I went into the main church. It was a little dark, but various night lights were on and it gave the space a warm glow. It was exceptionally quiet. I sat in the front row of pews and just let my mind wander, my eyes glazing over as I looked at the gold of the tabernacle. I breathed deeply. I thought of the past day; all that went on, the many happenings and people I came across. I laughed to myself at the joke I heard one of you tell me after Mass. I got a lump in my throat thinking about a person who had just lost a loved one. I thought of the many souls I had seen last Sunday at church, and those I didn't see last Sunday at church. I tried to picture myself at the altar as a priest and wondered if I looked silly or fat up there. I put my upcoming responsibilities before my mind and tried to reassure myself that I would do okay or be able to fulfill everything I had on my plate.

In other words, that night I prayed, I really prayed. Starting with what was on my mind and in my heart, I talked it over in God's presence and it was prayer. Prayer is actually easy if you don't complicate things with high sounding words or clever phrases. Prayer is easy when it's just you before God just as you are.

After a short while, a quiet came over me and a great feeling of peace washed over me. Then a deep feeling of gratitude to God filled my whole self. He was right there for me. I may not have been able see Him. I couldn't really sense Him in the normal way, but I know He was there. I closed my eyes and all I could say was to thank God for so many blessings He had given me: the absolute privilege of being a Catholic priest; having great parishes to watch over, with so many people that appreciate me and honestly love me; my family; my past, and my future. It got to be too much for words. I just sat for a while there in our church in the Lord's presence. Everything made sense. It all had meaning.

I hope you have had experiences like this and will have many more in the future. This won't come to you unless you try. It may take a while, many hours on your knees before God, but it will be worth the effort. Let's pray for one another and when you have trouble sleeping at night, a little praying might be just what you need.

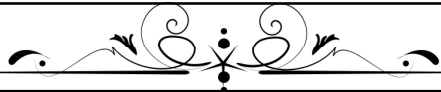

## PASTORAL COUNCIL MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 10, 2018

Present: Father Barry Stechschulte, Dave Dwenger, Ellen Brown, Chris Knatz, Ed Poeppelman (maintenance), Kent Schlegel, Dave Steinke, Linda Lunz, Nick Brackman, Luanna Scott. Not Present: Vern Yahl.

The meeting was called to order and opened with a prayer led by Kent Schlegel.

Ed Poeppelman made a motion to accept the minutes of August 13, 2018, as emailed. Dave Steinke seconded the motion.

**New Business:** Kevin Ott, representing Regal Plumbing and Heating Company, went over 2 proposals for air conditioning for the church focusing mainly on cooling the sanctuary area. Council and Father went over both proposals and decided the 5 ton split AC system costing \$14,408 would cool most of the church. If we have volunteer help with the installation of the ductwork, a savings of \$4,000 to \$5,000 could be credited to the estimate. Father and Council decided since the church is being renovated and fully accessible, now is the time to install the duct work. All work that can be completed will be done during the renovation with the actual AC unit being installed next spring. The AC will run when needed, not continually.

**Old Business:** Father reported Brian Brothers will be here on September 17th with the plaster repairs being done first. Carpeting has been chosen and Mel's Decorating came September 11th to do the final measuring and will give us a final estimate. The church pews have been removed and council is looking for someone to restore the pews at a reasonable cost. New kneelers will be installed when the pews are put back into the church. Used chairs have been purchased for the back of church that are in excellent condition. Harrod and Nagel Electric will be contacted to give us an estimate for the addition of lights and other areas that are in need of repair. A new water line from the rectory will be installed to the sacristy and bathroom.

CCD will start on September 12th, with class time 6:30-7:30pm. Children's Masses will start after the church renovations are completed on the second Sunday of each month thru April. Teachers for this year will be Candy Kentner 1st-2nd, Sara Ott 3rd - 4th, Shannon Schwartz 5th-6th, Peg Oen 7th-8th and Virgil Brown-high school.

Father announced he will be gone from October 15th-26th for his trip to Italy.

The meeting ended with a prayer. Next scheduled meeting will be October 8, at 7:00 pm, at the St. Patrick rectory.
