## **Message from the Pastor**

In the end, it's all about Roe vs. Wade.

In 1973, a case went before the Supreme Court involving a young mother who wanted to legally abort (kill) her unborn (preborn) child. Norma McCorvey was used as the plaintiff in an attempt to challenge Texas law prohibiting abortion. She ended up giving birth to the child and later converted to Christianity and was outspoken for her pro-life views.

Since that decision in 1973, the Supreme Court has affirmed the legalization of abortion on demand and it has become "settled law" in our country; one can legally kill an unborn baby. However, the decision is a flawed one, especially in light of modern medical science. But there has been so much pressure from pro-abortion groups like Planned Parenthood that this decision has been upheld over the past 45 years. Some state legislators have put restrictions on abortion, but many of them have been shot down by the higher court.

And so, we come to Judge Brett Kavanaugh, the nominee for the Supreme Court. I'm convinced that the delay in his confirmation by the so-called sex scandals is being done solely for the purpose of preventing him from being named a justice on the highest court in the land. He is a Roman Catholic. He would make a fifth and deciding vote on many issues before the court. It would be the first time we had a majority of justices who were true constitutionalists and conservative. It would be a turning point in the fight for life in our country.

So, as I said, it's all about Roe vs. Wade. If that horrible decision is reversed, abortion will be illegal in the United States, as it should be. Some say we must change hearts before we change laws. I say that changing an unjust and murderous law will change hearts. There may be war in our country as a result, but so be it. Some will scream in anger, but we will save lives.

How torturous it must be to be a supreme court justice and not be able to right a terrible wrong in our laws. Now, when Judge Kavanaugh joins the supreme court, they can do it. The horrifying spectacle of legalized killing of innocent babies in the womb will come to an end. May it be so.

### **Mission trip to Henderson Settlement**

Our mission trip to Henderson Settlement in Frakes, Kentucky was a success. Our goal was to construct a barbed wire and high tinsel strength electric fence. The settlement had the posts already installed, so we ran the wires and taught them how to make the wire connections and use the tightening tools. The ladies of the group sorted clothing and organized furniture for display in their thrift stores. The greatest need at this time is wash cloths and towels to improve hygiene of the children. The fencing project will cost \$14,000 to complete, so the money collected in our second collection was allocated for that. We made friends with folks from Columbus, Ohio and two church groups from North Carolina. Please pray for financial donations from across the country to help offset the overhead costs of operating a non-profit charitable organization. About 80% of their expenses need to be paid by donations from people like us. We plan to visit the settlement again, but haven't set a date at this time. Thanks again for your generous support and prayers for the well being of the folks who live in poverty.
