Charitable Giving Plan for IRA's

Are you frustrated by the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) rule for your IRA? If you are like most people receiving annual income from IRA, you are likely paying more in taxes each year. The good news is that rolling over all or a part of your RMD to a charity like Holy Rosary School, Holy Rosary Church or Friends of Holy Rosary, can help reduce your tax bill while supporting the ministry of Holy Rosary Church or School.

When you reach the age of 70 ½ years, the government requires you to take a Required Minimum Distribution each year. Congress has passed a law that gives you another option. Although there are different situations for different people, many of us can use the "IRA Charitable Rollover" to donate up to \$100,000 per year to your favorite qualified charity. The IRA Charitable Rollover allows you to directly transfer a RMD from your IRA without counting it as income thus reducing taxes. This option will allow you to maximize your gifts to Holy Rosary or Friends of Holy Rosary.
