MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

A new year and a new start in the battle for life in our country. The pro-life movement has made tremendous progress in protecting the lives of our unborn children (actually they should be called "pre-born" children). Several states have enacted laws banning some abortions, like late term abortions, requiring parental consent for minors, showing ultrasound images to the mothers before the actual procedure, and making sure abortion clinic have connections to local hospitals. Our federal government has stopped some funding of a major abortion provider, Planned Parenthood. Unfortunately, the courts have not upheld many of these laws. But that is changing, as the current administration has put in a record number of judges who are more conservative.

But we can't stop there. Every life is important – the life of the unborn child, but also the life of the born child and of the mother. What are you going to do in 2020 for the lives of the unborn? Have you committed to praying every day for an end to abortion in our country? Have you decided to vote only for pro-life candidates in upcoming elections? Have you donated to the local pregnancy centers and food pantries? Are you going to go and join the thousands of people in Washington DC on Friday January 24th to protest the Supreme Court decision, Roe v Wade, which legalized abortion? Have you considered joining the pro-life movement to do specific work for life in our area?
