MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Do you know how many abortions are done each year worldwide? You are not going to believe this, but according to World Health Organization (WHO), **there were an estimated 56 million abortions per year worldwide (data from 2011-14)**. This corresponds to over **150,000 abortions per day, over 6,000 per hour, over 100 per minute, more than one per second!**

Even though the rate of abortions in the United States is at a low point compared to the past, worldwide abortion is still a major killer of innocent life. Check out the website www.worldometers.info/abortions/. They have a counter marking the number of abortions being performed. It's frightening to see.

In our country the number of abortions is around 860,000 (in 2017). That's a lot of babies who will never see the light of day. That's about 18% of all pregnancies. How can this be? How can we sit by and be indifferent to the legally justified mass murder of innocent human beings?!

On the WHO website under the health topic of abortion (www.who.int/health-topics/abortion#tab=tab_1), they stress the danger of "unsafe" abortion procedures. There were approximately 25 million unsafe abortions worldwide out of the 56 million abortions that took place on average each year. Unfortunately, women die because of these unsafe practices, and that is not good. But, nearly 100% of the babies die as a result of abortion! (There are rare cases of a baby surviving an abortion attempt, and sometimes they are left to die without medical care.) So, all abortions are unsafe for the babies!

I think it is time to mobilize our efforts for the Pro-Life Movement. Get involved. Give to the various groups that promote life, like the pregnancy centers in our area. Use your voice, and your vote, to protect the innocent life of the baby in the womb. It is a fundamental issue of our times; a crucial issue on which all our rights depend. Without the right to life, all others are lost.

Keep praying. Keep forming your sons and daughters to respect life and to use the gift of sexuality in the proper way so that they can bring life into the world in a loving family bound by the covenant of marriage. We need to get to work to build a culture of life. Let's get at it! What are you going to do today for Life?
