## MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

How would you feel if you read the following headline?

*"Twenty-one-week old baby survives birth and is in stable condition"*

Or how about this headline, how would you react?

*"Dismembered infant with crushed skull found in medical waste container"*

The first would be an uplifting story about the precious life of a child who survived all odds and lived. The second would be the horrifying, senseless and gruesome fate of a little baby brutally torn apart and killed.

The first case actually did occur. A Texas girl, Lyla, just 21 weeks old, was born weighing only 14.5 ounces, with her eyes still fused shut. She is now a healthy 5 years old girl... a real miracle story. Sadly, the second case has also taken place and is repeated many times each year at abortion clinics throughout our country. According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, in 2015, 1.3% of the 638,169 abortions that year were done to infants at 21 weeks or older (out of 40 weeks of normal pregnancy). That's nearly 8,296 babies! So, the headline could have read something like this: *"Mass killing of nearly 8,300 viable infants...Dismembered bodies of babies found in medical waste in 2015!"*

Twenty-one weeks was the age that little Lyla survived outside the womb of her mother. Eight thousand, two hundred and ninety-six babies of that same age or older were dismembered, torn limb from limb, and brutally killed by abortion practitioners right here in our county in one year...and it's legal!!! The medical term for this procedure is the Dilation and Evacuation (D & E) Method of Abortion, where the cervix is dilated and the fetus removed using tools, sometimes tearing tissue. That is how it was described in a pro-abortion article in the Washington Post. Do we grasp what is happening to viable babies in our country 8,300 times a year? Do we know what pain those individuals suffer? (Studies have shown the reality of fetal pain.) Doesn't this terrible truth move you to action?

Today several state legislations have proposed a ban on "dismemberment" abortion procedures (D & E Method). None are in place due to the courts blocking them. Today we can't even appeal to a sense of decency and humanity and put a ban on such a gruesome procedure. Where is their heart? Where is their compassion for that little baby? But that's where we are in this fight for life in 2020. Even 8,296 babies being torn apart in the course of one year, their lives ended because they were not wanted or were an "inconvenience" to their parents, cannot change the minds of people and the law. We must keep praying, and working, to change hearts and not hide the ugly truth of abortion.

Auglaize County Right to Life is pleased to announce that we will be sponsoring the county contest for Ohio Right to Life's 2020 State Oratory Contest.
