## MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

What is an "unwanted" pregnancy? We hear this when we are discussing abortion. It comes up as a reason to end the pregnancy by abortion. Of course, ending a pregnancy means an end to the life inside the womb. If it were just a tumor or a clump of tissue, we could do away with it. But it's not. It is a distinct human being; more specifically, an individual human person.

So, when we talk about an unwanted pregnancy, we are talking about not wanting a person to live. Imagine what that means. We can end the life of someone we don't want. With this mentality, where does it end? That's why we speak of a "culture of death" and how, just as easily, we will ascent to euthanasia and assisted suicide – because we've cheapened the value of life itself based on our wants.

Just think of the little child born after a botched abortion procedure. How would you feel if you knew that you were not wanted and were intended to be put to death? This has happened. Gianna Jessen was born at 30 weeks after an attempted saline abortion (that is when a salt-water solution is injected in the amniotic sac to cause the uterus to contract and the infant to be expelled). Gianna lived through this procedure and now gives witness talks around the world. She was not wanted; her life was supposed to be terminated. How do you think she feels about that? (She has never met her biological mother, but the good news is she did forgive her.)

The reason a woman seeks an abortion is complicated. But in general, the pregnancy is not wanted for some reason. It is usually an inconvenience on the lifestyle and responsibilities of the mother, especially financial concerns. Cases are very rare of danger to the mother's health being the reason. So, in effect, it's okay to end the life of a person because they get in the way of what the mother wants to do in her life or because money matters more than the life of a child. An unwanted pregnancy is usually unintended, many times due to a failure of artificial contraception. And today we don't want to live with the consequences of our actions, even to the point of not wanting a person to live.

This mentality has to change before we will see an end to the horror of abortion. The value of that new life in the womb has to be affirmed. Adoption is one way to do this. If a mother does not want her child, there is someone out there who would love that child. Mother Teresa told the audience at her Nobel Peace Prize acceptance speech that she is fighting abortion with adoption and that she is giving children a home where they are wanted. So, why kill that little, defenseless child in the womb? Why not give it a chance to live and love...and be loved! Death is not the answer! A person deserves a chance to live. In the end, there should be no "unwanted" pregnancies. That little person in the womb has a right to live and be wanted.

## Minutes of the Holy Rosary Pastoral Council – January 21, 2020

Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by Matt Kinkley and opened with prayer led by Jim Schloemer.

Members present: Matt Kinkley, Pam Rammel, Doug Moran, Charlotte Duncan, Peg Larkin, Nick Kiel, Al Meinerding, Jim Schloemer, Tom Scott, Linda Tebbe, Stephen Jones, Deacon Marty and Fr. Barry.

The minutes of the October 22, 2019 meeting were approved as e-mailed.

Newly elected members, Linda Tebbe and Tom Scott, and re-elected members, Matt Kinkley and Pam Rammel, were sworn in.

**Altar Society** - Lil Heitkamp reported as of the November 9th meeting, there is \$11,255.63 in their account. The Fall bake sale brought in \$1,143.15. Zion Lutheran Church hosted the Advent Breakfast on December 3rd. The Society is asking for volunteers to help make baby blankets ... 40" x 36". Fruit baskets were delivered to shut-ins at Christmas. Gifts were given to Fr. Barry (\$150), Deacon Marty (\$100), and Seminarian Stephen Jones (\$50). There was no December meeting because of snow. Next meeting is in March.

**K of C** - December was busy: chicken fry on Brown/Bengals Sunday brought on \$800 for the Council; hosted a visit with Santa for our Sunday School children; donated \$500 toward the purchase of an Ultrasound for the New Life Center in Sidney; and the 1st annual Christmas Breakfast Buffet on December 15th. The Football Frenzy ticket campaign brought in \$700 to the Council, and we had several weekly winners.

On January 8th, we participated in a work night at Agape, loading several hundred bags with food items. Beginning January 10th, for 7 weeks, we are donating the use of the Hall to the Marriage Enrichment Program *7 Sensational Dates* hosted by Gene and Cindy Wilker.

The Annual Free Throw contest for boys & girls, ages 9-14, was held Sunday, January 19th.

The German Dinner to benefit Rustic Hope, will be January 25th, in our cafeteria. A 2nd German dinner, also cooked by our chefs to benefit Rustic Hope, will be held February 22nd, and will be sponsored by the Versailles St. Denis K of C, at their hall.

Recent Pro-Life signature campaign was very successful with over 250 names appearing in the Pro-Life Day ad. In addition to paying for the ad, Council was able to donate \$1,000 to the Family Life Center here in town. We will also reward and publicly acknowledge the first baby born at our hospital on or after January 22nd.

Dates for the Lenten Friday fish fries are : February 28, March 6, 13, 27 and April 3.

We continue to recruit faithful, practicing Catholic men. Learn more about the Knights at [kofo.org/joinus](http://kofo.org/joinus). To become a Knight at the local Council, a qualified man must participate in the traditional, morally principled initiation, which is scheduled at the local Council at least once a month. At any time an online application may be filled out to become an online Knight. This membership gives him online access to all the news, resources and products of the Knights of Columbus. However, to become a member of the local council, he will still need to be properly initiated.

**Education/Religious Education** - Nan Mielke reported. Adult Faith Formation – Advent with Fr. Mike Schmitz. We had about 40 people attending each week. This is the same program that our High School 10-12th grades have been using this semester. Opportunity was given for Confession for all CCD students during Advent and the opportunity will be given during Lent.

Our boys CYO basketball team is doing well.

*7 Great Dates* began January 10th and runs 7 consecutive Fridays. It is at full capacity.

Thursday Night RCIA has 15 and a few more discerning candidates.

Trying *Magnifikid* for the K-6th grade CCD students to help them better follow along with Mass – it has all the prayers and readings for each Sunday. Response from parents & grandparents has been positive, but have not noticed many being used at Mass. Grades 3-6th are also using *Gospel Weeklies* – will probably go back to *Gospel Weeklies* with an option for parents to purchase *Magnifikids* at the start of the school year. 4 year olds will start to receive *Magnifikids* instead of 6th grade.

Youth Group – We are looking for young adults to help with Youth Group and CCD next year at the high school level. Stephanie Kramer has moved from the area, Her final night leading CONNECT was December 18th.

Boys ConQuest meets on Thursday Nights and has 30 K - 8<sup>th</sup> graders participating in learning about leading virtuous lives, their Catholic Faith and Lives of the Saints. Looking for dads (men) to help!

Victory Girls Club started November 6th, after school until 4pm. We meet Wednesdays, every other week, through the rest of the school year. There are 7 participating.

Sunday School has 36 registered. First Reconciliation is January 29th, at 7:00pm, in the church.

Totus Tuus dates are June 28 – July 2, 4 full days rather than 5 this year.

Spa for the Soul will be March 27, 5:30 – 8:30pm, with Julia Monnin as the Keynote speaker with the focus on prayer & forgiveness.

Parish mission this year will once again be with Fr. Chris March 15, 16, & 17th, from 6:30 – 8:00pm, followed by Parish Penance service on the 18th.

Lenten Studies:

No Greater Love – a Biblical Walk through Christ's Passion will be held at Holy Rosary Tuesdays at 9 am and in the evening at St. Patrick's Rectory from 7-8:30 pm, with Linda Lunz leading the group.

Momnipotent Group - Trying to get younger moms together to help bring faith into lives and support/enhance faith lived within the family. Stacy Smith will lead this on Wednesday evenings 6:45 – 8:00pm in the teachers' lounge.

9 catechists attended the Deanery wide Catechetical meeting in Montezuma.

School Report - Kindergarten children have been to Tri Star for an early education program and to the High School Wood Shop to make snowmen.

Catholic Schools Week is January 27-31, with the focus on Pray, Lead, Serve, Light, Succeed With God Knowing All Things Are Possible.

Damascus Retreat experience coming up for grades 5-8 at Lehman along with our Northern Area Mass.

Weekly Masses are using a variety of participation.

Registration for next school year begins in February. Kindergarten screening and orientation dates are set.

There will be no laundry detergent sales this year, being replaced by Spring flowers sale.

Night at the Races is set for March 7th.

**Maintenance** - New led lights were installed in the upper half of the light fixtures in the church. Made 3 repairs to the rectory roof. Church boilers have been cleaned and resealed their exhaust manifolds. The drive linkages in the boiler water pumps have been changed. Completed the HVAC control upgrade. Hobart was here to work on the dishwasher and advised to keep it as long as possible since newer models are not lasting as long. Installed stained glass windows in the narthex. The Charlie Wilker family has retired from snow removal and we are seeking someone else to assist us. At Gethsemane we have graded the driveways and finished installing the foundations for the season.

Deacon Marty presented a power point demonstration of the capabilities of the New Idea Control-HVAC. This state of the art controller allows all aspects of the system to be monitored and controlled by computer or phone (at this time, only if on campus). This allows more efficient use of the system.

**Finances** - Committee will be meeting in February.

**Liturgy Board** - Met before Christmas and will meet in near future to plan Easter.

**Old Business** – Thank you to out-going members of Council, Robbie Burke and Jim Schloemer for their years of service. Hand sanitizer will be available for use before distributing communion.

**Open Agenda** - Strategic Direction - a survey was passed out to council to begin planning for faith/spiritual/community growth opportunities for our parish to focus on.

Update on the HVAC system - New Idea Control – HVAC has been completed and implemented.

Update on Capital Campaign – no report has been received yet but 93% of pledges has been paid so far.

The 2nd Collection for Capital Improvements will be reinstated the 3rd week of each month beginning in February. Envelopes have been in use, but with only one collection.

**New Business** – Election of Officers: Matt Kinkley, President; Nick Kiel, Vice President; Charlotte Duncan, Secretary. Deacon Marty presented information on a John Deere 1025R compact utility tractor at a purchase price of \$18,000. After 7 years of using personal equipment to maintain the cemetery and to gain a good understanding of what is needed and what time allows to be done, Deacon Marty has chosen this model because it has only 88hrs, it is a 2018 model selling for \$8,000 less than new. His son's, John Deere technicians, can service it. It does not have a mower deck, but we don't have the time to mow the cemetery. It does have a loader with a solid bucket and pallet forks to assist in moving large items, the ability to grade driveways, and a small backhoe to assist in installing foundations for headstones which are currently dug by hand. The mechanical thumb will come in handy for removing stumps and bushes. After questions and discussion, Council voted in favor of purchasing this tractor.

Painting behind the statues in church will be finished by June 1<sup>st</sup>. Wood sheeting and trim to match the door frames will be installed so the artist has a canvas to paint on behind the 3 main statues. The remaining 6 statues do not require this.

**Pastor's Report** - Fr. Barry stated that there are several new courses of study coming up and to please take advantage of them, especially the Parish Mission with Fr. Chris, March 15 – 17.

New statues are being placed in the south entrance, St. Philomina, donated by the Al Meinerding family is already in place and a 2nd, St. Dominic, donated by the Stechschulte family, will be placed there in the near future.
