MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

How is everyone doing? We are in strange times, aren't we? Are you starting to get stir crazy stuck in your home? Me, too. I am beginning to get my bearings as far as what I need to be doing these days. It's hard to get on a regular schedule. I am getting up each morning and celebrating Mass in my living room. So, I'm not sleeping in and going around in my pajamas all day. I do miss the daily Mass goers. And Sunday was a trip. Having Mass in church with no one there but my organist, cantor, cameraman, deacon, and seminarian, was surely a new experience for me as a priest. But we did our best. We soldier on.

If you missed the Mass at Holy Rosary on Facebook, my homily was about our appreciation for the gift of Holy Communion. As I said in my homily, I am saddened that you can't go to Mass and Holy Communion these days. I feel privileged to receive Jesus every day. How I wish I could somehow give you all Communion. I thought about having Mass and broadcasting it by radio for people in their cars in the church parking lot. Then people could drive up and receive Communion. But that idea was shot down by the higher ups, saying we could pass the virus from one car to another.

I also stressed in my homily how we must be prepared to receive Holy Communion. Now that you can't receive Communion, you should examine yourselves and see if you are ready to receive your God and Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. We must be pure and free from sin to receive Purity Itself and the Sinless One. As St. Paul says, it's not good to receive Communion if you are still in sin – you eat and drink condemnation on yourself. That's not good. I think our problem has been that we have had long lines for Holy Communion and short lines for Confession. To receive Holy Communion with mortal sin on our souls is a grave offense against God.

Christ definitely calls the sinner and not the righteous. But we must be repentant sinners to be able to receive Him at Mass. So, if there is sin in your life, bring it to our Lord in the confessional. Purify yourselves and be unshackled from the slavery that sin is. Use a good examination of conscience and really put yourself on trial so to speak. Then come to your Merciful Savior and be restored to grace. Then, desire to receive Jesus in Holy Communion. And when we finally can do that again, be so thankful for the gift He gives you.

May God bless us all with a deeper faith in the Eucharist and a clearer realization of the great gift that it is, spurring us on to a more repentant life and receiving Holy Communion more devoutly and worthily.
