MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Happy Easter to all! And a very different Holy Week and Easter it was this year. Just when I thought I was falling into routine and just doing the same old same old, a virus comes along and throws a wrench into my life. Who could have foreseen such a time like we've had these past few weeks? Hasn't it been surreal?

What is God asking of us during these days? Maybe He's saying that we are vulnerable; that we can't just go along about our business in our own little world and not be focused on the important things in life, like our relationship to Him and the living of our Christian Faith. When things are taken away from us, that's when we start to think about them more. Hopefully, our life in the Church has come into clearer sight these days. It was too easy to have church in our lives, wasn't it? Now that it's shut off from us (at least the public gatherings in church...we can still visit church, everyday even, if we want) do you miss going to church as a family of believers? I sure miss all of you out in the pews. Having Mass in an empty church is a strange thing, let me tell you.

Ask yourself, is there a difference in your life during this time of shutdown and social distancing as regards to the Church? Is there a hole in your life not being able to go to Mass and receive Holy Communion? If not, then we have to look at where our faith is and what church means to us.

We won't be coming together for Mass until May 10th. Ugh. So, we have to make some adjustments. Watching online is the first thing we can do. Next, put times for prayer in your daily routine, especially if you are confined in your home. I have been praying more than I ever have these days. God is giving us this opportunity to experience Him in prayer in our homes and with our families. Let's take advantage of it.

And make sure you are praying for all those affected by this terrible virus, for the perseverance of the healthcare workers, and for all those who have died because of this pandemic, here and around the world.

May God continue to bless you with health, happiness and especially holiness all the days of your life.
