

# Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

## Message from the Pastor

Easter is all about transformation: The crown of thorns becomes the glorious crown of the King of Heaven and Earth; the cross of torture becomes the Tree of Life; loss turns into victory; shame into joy; death becomes life. All of this is made possible through the power of God who wills all that is good and only permits evil so that He can bring about an even greater good. Although this is most evident in Jesus Christ and His Passion and Death which becomes Resurrection, this isn't something that God wants to keep from us. All of us, by that same power of God, are invited to the transformational power of God no matter who we are.

And let's face it: if 2020 showed us anything, it showed us that we need the transformational power of God in our lives. The world is wrought with chaos, violence, uncertainty, and powerlessness and a life without Christ is bound to be swallowed up by all that. But when we come to Mass and receive the Lord Jesus Christ in the Eucharist—and we do receive Him, not a symbol of Him, but Jesus Himself!—we are receiving the power of God. In that tiny, seemingly insignificant moment of receiving what appears in the eyes of the world as bread, but what we know by faith to be Jesus, the chaos of our life is transformed into order, violence into peace, uncertainty into knowledge, and powerlessness trembles at the power of God.

Life with Christ can transform even the worst parts of our daily life. It can transform our most disliked task into an act of love for the One who loves me. It can transform the most painful circumstances into a moment of encounter with the Lord. Christ showed us that He was unafraid to enter our painful and messy circumstances by embracing the pain and messiness of the Cross.

It's a life with Jesus that makes life truly worth living. And Christ wants that for you; He wants you. Many people have been away from Mass this year. Some because that's the way they've chosen to live their life, some because of the pandemic, some might not even know why they've been away. But know that you're always welcome back. Know that at the drop of a hat, Jesus is ready to pour out His transformational power upon you, to help you to change your life, to choose Him and His Kingdom. This church is your home and we're glad you're here and if you want that transformational power of God in your life, you've come to the right place.

# Update to COVID Guidelines

Easter is upon us and hopefully we have all drawn closer to Christ. There's also been another way that we've been "drawing closer" and that's to each other because the number of people coming back to Mass has been increasing! It's a great problem to have and one that we hope that we continue to have. With over a third of the country having been vaccinated and the age to qualify for being vaccinated dropping rapidly, we hope and pray with all of you for a speedy end to the pandemic and all of the extra precautions. It's important to remember that we're not there yet; we still need to continue wearing masks to Mass, maintaining social distance (now only 3 feet per the CDC).

There's also been an important update with the Archdiocesan guidelines. Namely, that there is still a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays for "those who have serious health concerns, either for themselves or for someone in their immediate care". This is a marked difference from the previous guidelines, which gave a blanket dispensation from that obligation. In other words, if the reason people are staying home from Mass is for any other reason than a serious health concern, they do not qualify for the dispensation and are committing a serious sin.

So the problem: more and more people coming back to Mass. Again, not a bad problem! But how are we going to accommodate for our increasing numbers? It's not an easy solution because there are a number of factors: Firstly, we are asked to follow state guidelines like social distancing and mask wearing by our Archbishop, so there is an obedience aspect to it. We also have parishioners who want to come to Mass, yet are concerned with contracting the virus, so there is a charity aspect to it. We want them to feel safe and welcomed.

However we also want to welcome as many people as possible. We could close the church if it gets too full or introduce a sign up system, but neither of these sound like good options. Many parishioners have suggested a practice that is happening at neighboring parishes: "opening" half the Church and keeping the other half social distanced. The benefit of this is that we can fit more people in the pews, and many parishioners have already received the vaccine or contracted the virus and don't mind sitting near someone. However we're hesitant about this approach for two reasons. Firstly, other priests have directly asked the Archbishop if we could do this and he didn't give us permission. Being blatantly disobedient sounds like a bad idea for the salvation of my soul! The second hesitation toward this approach is that it segregates the Church. There would be a very visible division between different groups of people and that creates division within a parish community. It doesn't seem prudent to introduce more division into an already divisive world.

**Here is the solution that we will try for the coming weeks:** We will leave the ropes on the pews, until we run out of room. When the pews fill up, we will begin to remove the ropes in the back pews and work our way forward. The ushers will be responsible for removing the ropes; please don't "help yourself". The ushers will lead the rope removal to ensure that we begin from the back and methodically move forward. The ushers will also be responsible for putting the ropes back on the pews after Mass. Therefore, if you are more concerned about contracting the virus, please sit towards the front of our Churches. If you are less concerned, please sit near the back. Additionally, the first four or five pews and the old overflow at Holy Rosary will all be "safe zones" that will not be opened up. This will provide a place where people can have that social distance guaranteed.

Please continue to sit with your family and friends that you are not social distancing from; that will open up more seating.

Let's continue to do what we need to do to get through this pandemic; let's guard our hearts from the temptations to be negative or uncharitable towards others. We're near the end, let's finish strong! Christ is coming; keep your eyes on Him, not on the ropes, not on the masks, on Him!

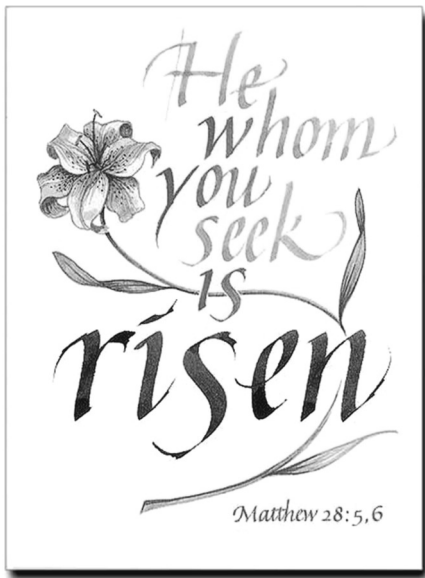
