




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News from the Religion Department:



"I invite all Christians, everywhere, at this very moment, to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ."- Pope Francis in Evangelii Gaudium, or The Joy of the Gospel, I, 2-3

This Advent, prepare to celebrate Jesus' arrival as an infant in the small town of Bethlehem. Born into poverty, he brings us the good news that God loves us - and calls us to give of ourselves to others. Let the example of Pope Francis, as he models the humility and generosity of our Savior, inspire you. Reflect on the pope's teachings, accompanied by Scripture, prayer, and action. Then go out and share the message: Jesus Christ is born!

From the School Nurse:

Parents: Please do not send your child to school after giving them Tylenol or Ibuprofen to treat a fever or other symptoms of illness at home. These medications wear off and then a child presents to me with elevated temperature, cough, headache, sore throat, etc. These different symptoms can be signs of a cold, or flu, or strep throat or another type of viral or bacterial infection after being in class. There have been 2 cases of a flu diagnosis that I am aware of in the last couple of weeks in the primary grades. Any child with a temperature 99.9 or above should not be sent to school and will be sent home if discovered here at school.

6th Grade Parents: When scheduling your child for a doctor's appointment in the coming year, please have the booster to the DTP and the Meningococcal vaccines given prior to the 2020 fall semester. These vaccinations are required for entry into 7th grade for all schools in Texas. Right now there are 23 6th graders who have not received the vaccines or there is no documentation in their school health file that they have received them.
